The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, not later than two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in

order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Saviour, situate at Brixton Hill as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Harold, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, and with the consent of the Reverend Nathaniel Arthur Garland, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said district parish of Saint Matthew, Brixton, which is described in the

schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Saviour, situate at Brixton Hill as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Brixton Hill.'

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Brixton Hill, being:

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty’s Chargé d’Affaires and Consul-General at Caracas, announcing a resolution by the

Government of Venezuela "that the Maritime Custom-house of Puerto Cabello be authorized to give permission to the national or foreign vessels that solicit it, with the object of going to Maracaibo to load fustic or dividive, and to sail from thence direct for Europe or the United States of America."
