THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, with the following translation of a Royal Spanish Order respecting the tonnage measurement of coal laden vessels in Spain :—

ROYAL ORDER.

His Majesty the King (whom God preserve) agreeing with your proposal has deigned to order

1. That the captains of vessels laden with coals shall come provided with a certificate from the Consul of Spain at the starting point, to be issued on presentation of the certificates of freight (polizas de fletamiento) and setting forth the quantity of fuel which they carry; the said document to serve as a basis for effecting the Customs' operations without prejudice to the verifications which may be made by the Custom-houses in cases of doubt.

2. That the Customs' operations now awaiting decision be carried out by taking the quantity which may have been declared by the consignees if they present the Consular Certificate proving that to be the quantity which the vessel received at the port of loading.

And 3. That information of the decision be given to our Consuls causing them to understand the importance which will be attached to the document which they are to issue and pressing them to show zeal for the best defence of fiscal interests.

By Royal Order I inform you of this, that it may have due effect.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in

this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The rates of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General (in lieu of those now payable) in respect of letters conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post, as mentioned and described in the Schedule hereunder written, shall be the rates of postage which are fixed and specified by and in such Schedule.

2. Any letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, or St. Helena, or posted in the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, or St. Helena, addressed to the United Kingdom, upon which no part or a part only of the postage chargeable thereon under this Warrant has been prepaid, shall be charged with the unpaid postage and an additional rate of postage of six pence.

3. Any letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to Ascension upon which no part or a part only of the postage chargeable thereon under this Warrant has been prepaid, shall be detained and opened, and returned or given up to the sender thereof.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

To the Overseers of the Poor of the Hamlet of Penge, in the County of Surrey;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the hamlet of Penge, in the county of Surrey, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said hamlet, held at the parochial offices, Penge, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 9th day of March, 1876, it was resolved,—

“That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force within this Hamlet as regards the whole of its provisions.”

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said hamlet have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the several Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—The whole of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said hamlet of Penge.

ARTICLE II.—The Overseers of the Poor of the said hamlet shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk, under the authority of this Order, a salary at the rate of one hundred pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as the Local Government Board may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE III.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of “The Apportionment Act, 1870,” and shall be paid quarterly on the 24th day of June, the 29th day of September, the 25th day of December, and the 25th day of March, in each year.

ARTICLE IV.—The Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and of this Order, in addition to the duties set forth in the said Act, and the duties which are or may be imposed upon Vestry Clerks by any Act or Acts of Parliament, shall discharge, as regards the said hamlet, the following duties:—

He shall conduct all applications, by or on behalf of the Overseers or Vestry, to any Justice or Justices at Petty or Special Sessions or out of Sessions; and shall perform and execute, without charge for anything beyond disbursements, all legal business connected with the Hamlet, or in which the Overseers or Vestry shall be engaged, except prosecutions at the Assizes or the Central Criminal Court, and prosecutions or other proceedings at the Quarter or General Sessions, and actions, suits, or other proceedings in the Superior Courts, and Parliamentary business.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
