And whereas the said amendments have been this day laid before Her Majesty in Council, the same are published in the London Gazette, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

And notice is hereby given, that it is lawful for the bodies or persons authorized so to do, in that Act, within two months from the date of the publication of this notification, to petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of such amendments of the Statutes.

*Amendments in Statutes.*

STATUTE X.

Sect. 1. To omit the words "the vacant" in the first line.

After Sect. 3 to insert (as a new paragraph) as follows:—

Such number of scholars shall be elected in each year as shall be equal to the number of scholarships which are vacant on the day of election, or must, under the statutes and regulations in force for the time being, become vacant on or before the 10th of January then next following.

To amend Sect. 5 so as to run thus:—

Any boy may be a candidate for a scholarship in any year whose age on the 1st of June in the same year shall not be less than 12 nor more than 14 years. Every candidate, &c.

After Sect. 5 to insert as follows :—

*Admission.*

The time for the admission of scholars shall be subject to regulation by the Governing Body.

Sect. 6. In lines 4 and 7, for the words "school-term" to substitute the words "school-half-year."

At the end of this section to insert the following :—

For the purposes of this statute the school-half-year shall be considered to end on the 10th of January or the 10th of August as the case may be.
