DOVER BAY.

Intended Fixed and Flashing Light on Admiralty Pier.

THE Board of Trade has given notice, that on and after the 11th day of October, 1876, a light will be exhibited from a tower recently erected on the outer end of the Admiralty Pier, Dover Bay.

The light will be a *fixed white* light varied by *flashes* at intervals of *seven seconds and a half*; it will be elevated 44 feet above high water, and in clear weather the fixed light should be visible from a distance of six to seven miles,—the flashes somewhat farther.

The tower, 30 feet high, is cylindrical and painted red.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

Also, that a bell will be sounded in foggy weather, giving single strokes at intervals of seven seconds and a half.

Also, that on and after the above-mentioned date, the blue light, at present shown from the end of the Admiralty Pier, will be discontinued.
