The bearing S. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. leads west of the sunken rocks outside Kvamsø (with the exception of Ristofluen), and east of Svartskjøer. The bearings S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. leads clear of the sunken rocks lying north of Staalet. The bearings of W.  $\frac{2}{3}$  N. leads north of Terneskjøerboen, near the north-east point of Haugsholmen. The bearing W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. leads north of Bleka and Nystølfuerne. In the direction of Nystøl the light is partly hidden, especially for small vessels, by the high part of Frekø, east of the light.

The lighthouse is painted white.

Position, lat.  $62^{\circ} 10' 30''$  N., long.  $5^{\circ} 22' 40''$  E.

The yearly period of exhibition of the light is from the 1st of August to the 15th of May.

There is good anchorage between Frekø and Haugsholmen, also east of Haugsholmen.
