THE Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland granting the dignity of a Baron of the said United Kingdom to Mortimer Sackville-West, Esq. (commonly called the Honourable Mortimer Sackville-West), and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron Sackville, of Knole, in the county of Kent, with remainders, in default of such issue male, to his brothers Lionel Sackville Sackville-West, Esq. (commonly called the Honourable Lionel Sackville Sackville-West), and William Edward Sackville-West, Esq. (commonly called the Honourable William Edward Sackville-West), severally and successively, and to the heirs male of their respective bodies lawfully begotten.
