**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order of 1875, foreign animals may be landed at the Port of Rochester.

3. All the regulations applicable to the landing of foreign animals at the ports named in Article 63 of the said Order shall apply to foreign animals landed at the Port of Rochester.
