Metropolitan Board of Works (Various Powers).

(Consolidation of bye-laws as to parks, and other open spaces, and alteration of such bye-laws, and of application of penalties thereunder; power to contribute to Public Recreation Ground at Forest-hill, and powers to Lewisham District Board of Works with reference thereto.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Metropolitan Board of Works (who are herein referred to as the Board) intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following, among other purposes, that is to say:—

To enable the Board to consolidate into one code all or any bye-laws made by them, or authorised under the powers of any Act hereinafter mentioned for managing, controlling, or regulating, or otherwise relating to any park, common, open space, embankment, square, ornamental ground; or other place, and to amend, alter, or repeal all or any of such bye-laws, and notwithstanding such consolidation, to continue in force, or from time to time to make any separate or special bye-law or bye-laws in reference to any such park, common, open space, embankment, square, ornamental ground, or place; and to confer upon the Board further powers for the making of bye-laws and the enforcement thereof by penalties, and to provide for the application of such penalties to the general purposes of the Board, or to such purposes as may be defined in the Bill.

To enable the Board to contribute out of any funds belonging to them or under their control any sum not exceeding £4,250 towards the cost incurred, or to be incurred in the purchase of land to be vested in, and used by the Lewisham District Board of Works, for the purposes of a public recreation ground at Forest-hill, such
