THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at San José, Costa Rica, reporting that a Decree was published in the Official Gazette of the 7th October last, prohibiting the importation of all spirituous liquors. The dates fixed for the operation of the Decree are the 22nd October for importations from the Pacific coast, the 22nd November for those from other parts of America, and the 4th January next for those from Europe.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Note addressed by the Turkish Foreign Minister to Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the Sublime Porte has decided to prohibit, until further notice, the exportation of cereals from the Province of Erzeroum. The Provincial Authorities will fix the date on which the prohibition is to come into force. An exception will be made in favour of contracts effected previous to the prohibition, and a period of one month will be allowed to merchants to produce and obtain the official visé to such contracts.
