THE following Notification has been received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Vienna:

#### (Translation.)

Notification of the Austrian Ministry of Commerce and Finance of the 24th November, published in the Journal of the Laws of the Empire, 22nd December, 1876, relative to the Customs Duties to be levied on Cotton and Woollen Goods, from the 1st of January, 1877.

In consequence of the expiration of the Treaty of Commerce entered into between Austria-Hungary and Great Britain on the 16th of December, 1865, and of the Convention of December 30, 1869, the import duties stipulated for in the latter will cease to be in force after the end of the year 1876, and will be regulated, from the 1st of January, 1877, until further notice, by the Customs stipulations contained in the Commercial Treaty with Germany of March 9, 1868, relative to the importation of cotton and woollen goods.
