THE Lords of the Committee of Council on Education have received from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department, a Royal Commission, of which the following is a copy, which Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to issue, appointing Commissioners to represent British and Colonial Exhibitors at the International Exhibition to be held at Paris, in 1878.

And lastly, We do by these presents ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue until the close of the said Exhibition, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time, and at any place or places, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint our trusty and well-

beloved Francis Philip Cunliffe Owen, Esquire, Companion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the twenty-second day of *January*, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the fortieth year of Our Reign.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1869.
