*By Her Majesty's Command.*

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who

is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon; one to be left with The Queen's Page in

attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee; a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The holding of all markets or sales of cattle, sheep, or goats within the Metropolis is hereby prohibited, except as follows:

(1.) Cattle, sheep, or goats belonging to the owner or occupier of premises not in an infected place may be sold on those premises if the cattle, sheep, or goats are not affected with cattle-plague and have been on those premises in possession of the owner or occupier thereof not less than 28 days immediately before the sale:

(2.) Markets and sales may be held under licence of the Privy Council.

If any cattle, sheep, or goats are sold, or exposed or put up for sale, in contravention of this Article, the seller and the purchaser thereof, and the auctioneer putting the same up for sale, or the person exposing the same for sale, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order; and if any person holds a market or sale, in contravention of this Article, or fails to comply with any of the conditions, provisions, or regulations of

any licence for the holding of a market or sale, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.

2. Cattle, sheep, or goats exposed for sale in a market, the holding whereof for the sale of cattle, sheep, or goats for immediate slaughter is licensed by the Privy Council, may be kept alive for a period of ten days after such exposure, and no longer.

If any person keeps any cattle, sheep, or goats alive in contravention of this Article, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.

3. The owner, consignee, or other person exposing in a market, the holding whereof for the sale of cattle, sheep, or goats for immediate slaughter is licensed by the Privy Council, any cattle, sheep, or goats shall, at his own expense, mark them as follows:

*Cattle*.—By clipping the hair off the end of the tail, and by clipping a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the left quarter.

*Sheep and Goats*.—By clipping a broad arrow, about four inches long, on the forehead.

If any person fails to comply with the provisions of this Article, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.

4. This order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869; and the provisions thereof are supplemental to and not in substitution of those of The Animals Order of 1875.

ORDER issued by Local Government Board: Altering Name of Union.

Cannock (Penkridge) Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Penkridge Union, in the county of Stafford;

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and Places comprised in the said Union;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876," it is enacted as follows:—

"The Local Government Board may, when they see fit, by their Order change the name of any Union, and direct how such change of name shall be published; no such change of name shall affect any rights or

"obligations of, or securities given by or to the said Union, or render defective any legal proceedings instituted by or against the said Union; and any legal proceedings may be continued or commenced by or against the said Union by their new name which might have been continued or commenced by or against the Union by their former name."

And whereas by an Order dated the 5th day of September, 1836, the Poor Law Commissioners declared that the several parishes and places specified in the margin thereof should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the poor under the name of the Penkrige Union; and it is expedient that the name of such Union should be changed as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows.

ARTICLE I.—On and after the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the name of the said Union shall be changed to the Cannock Union, and the Guardians of the Poor thereof shall be termed "The Guardians of the Poor of the Cannock Union."

ARTICLE II.—All Orders, Rules, and Regulations heretofore issued by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, or the Local Government Board, to the Guardians of the Poor of the Penkrige Union, which may be in force in the said Penkrige Union, and in the several parishes and places comprised therein, on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, shall be and continue to be in force in the said Cannock Union, and in the several parishes and places comprised therein, as though they had been addressed to such Union by the name of the Cannock Union.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians of the Penkrige Union shall cause this Order to be published for two successive weeks within one month from the date hereof, in some newspaper circulating within the Union.
