## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

*o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Buenos Ayres, enclosing a copy of a Decree dated the 7th February, containing the following modifications of Articles 16 and 21 of the Regulations respecting Pilotage in the Argentine Republic, viz. :—

ART. 16.—Every individual who shall pilot a vessel in Argentine waters without being a pilot licensed by the Republic shall pay to the Board of Direction of the Society of Pilots a sum equivalent to the pilotage provided for by the tariff in such cases.

ART. 21.—All seagoing vessels bound for Argentine ports must take from Point Indio Light-vessel a pilot having an Argentine license.

With a view to carry this arrangement into effect there shall be at all times at that point a sufficient number of pilots either free or belonging to the Society and licensed by the Republic in order to conduct vessels destined as above.

It is stated that the foregoing modifications were to come into force 30 days after the date of the above decree.

### THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1876. FURTHER RULES FOR COURTS OF SURVEY IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

WHEREAS by the 9th section of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, it is provided that the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain may from time to time, with the consent of the Treasury, so far as relates to fees, make, and when made, revoke, alter, and add to, General Rules to carry into effect the provisions of that Act, with respect to a Court of Survey, and in particular, amongst other things, with respect to the amount and application of the fees to be received therein:

And whereas it is expedient, with a view to the proper application of the fees to be received in Courts of Survey, to provide for their collection by means of stamps:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Hugh MacCalmont, Baron Cairns, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, with the consent of the Treasury, do order as follows:

1. The fees set forth in Appendix C to the General Rules established for Courts of Survey in the United Kingdom, bearing date the 29th September, 1876, shall be taken in stamps, to be impressed, so far as may be possible, on the documents to which they refer, such impressed stamps to be obtained from the Commissioners of Inland Revenue in London, or from their stamp distributors.

2. Immediately on the termination of an appeal before a Court of Survey elsewhere than in London, the Registrar of the Court shall forward to the Registry of the Court of Survey for London, at Somerset House, London, for deposit therein, all the papers, stamped and unstamped, belonging to the said appeal.
