"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-ninth and fortieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-ninth and fortieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the Bishoprick of Truro.

"Whereas the Bishoprick of Truro aforesaid was founded by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month which Order was made in pursuance of the fourth section of the above-men-

tioned Act, and which Order as appears by the terms thereof, came into operation on the said fifteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

"And whereas by the same Order it is ordered that the diocese of the Bishoprick of Truro shall consist of the Archdeaconry of Cornwall which at the date of the said Order was an archdeaconry within the diocese of Exeter.

"And whereas by the same Order the parish church of Saint Mary in the town and borough of Truro in the county of Cornwall, was assigned (subject to the rights of the patron and incumbent of the same church) to the Bishoprick of Truro as a cathedral church.

"And whereas by the same Order the Bishop of Truro was constituted a body corporate and was invested with all such rights privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

"And whereas by the seventh section of the said Act of the thirty-ninth and fortieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-four it is enacted that whenever a certain certificate shall have been given to your Majesty by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England we shall lay before your Majesty a scheme for all or any of certain matters which in the same section are mentioned.

"And whereas the said certificate has been given as by the said Order of your Majesty in Council of the ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six appears.

"Now therefore we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that:—

"(1.) The Bishop for the time being of the diocese of Truro shall have all such courts and officers, and all such jurisdiction, as are at present, or were at the time of the passing of the said Order of your Majesty in Council possessed by the Bishop of the diocese of Exeter within the Archdeaconry of Cornwall; and that all terriers, tithe apportionments, maps, plans and other docu-
