date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Catherine Loughborough Park.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parlia-

ment.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Catherine, Loughborough

Park being:—
"All that portion of the new parish of Saint

John Angell Town in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Winchester which together with the contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint Jude East Brixton and of the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton (both in the county and diocese aforesaid) constitutes that triangular block of territory which (speaking generally) is bounded on the north-west by the line of the South London Railway on the south-west by the main line of the London Chatham and Dover Railway and on the east by the Herne Hill and City Branch of the last-named line of railway all which said portions of the three cures above named may be more particularly described as being comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Hinton-road on the eastern side of the bridge which carries the line of the Herne Hill and City Branch of the London Chatham and Dover Railway aforesaid over the said road at which point the boundary dividing the new parish of Saint Paul Herne Hill in the county and diocese aforesaid from the new parish of Saint Saviour Herne Hill-road in the same county and diocese joins the boundary dividing the last-named new parish from the new parish of Saint John Angell Town aforesaid and extending thence that is from the said point north-westward for a distance of four chains or thereabouts along the last-described boundary thereby following the middle of Hinton-road aforesaid and passing under the said bridge to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the South London Railway over the said road and extending thence south-westward for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts along the middle of the lastmentioned line of railway (thereby passing through the Loughborough Park Railway Station and crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Angell Town from the district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton aforesaid) to the centre of the bridge which carries the same line of railway over the main line of the London Chatham and Dover Railway aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward for a distance of fifty-one chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said district parish of Saint Matthew Brixton from the new parish of Saint Jude East Brixton aforesaid) to a point at the juuction of the said main line of the London Chatham and Dover Railway with the said line of the Herne Hill and City Branch of the same railway upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Jude East Brixton from the new parish of Saint Paul Herne Hill aforesaid and extending thence northward for a distance of fifty-one chains or thereabouts along the last-mentioned boundary thereby

following the middle of the last-named branch line of railway to the point at the southern end of the bridge which carries the same branch line of railway over Hinton-road as aforesaid where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Angell Town from the new parish of Saint Paul Herne Hill aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of one chain or thereabouts along the last-mentioned boundary to the first-described point in the middle of Hinton-road as aforesaid where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the three cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twelfth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty chapter forty-nine of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church situate within the limits of the particular district or new parish of Saint Peter, Higher Bebington, otherwise called or known as Rock Ferry, sometime part of the parish of Bebington in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church called Christ Church situate as aforesaid.
