Penalty for Breach of Bye-laws.

V. Any person committing a breach of these Bye-laws, or any of them, shall, be subject to a penalty not exceeding two shillings and sixpence, provided that all breaches of these Bye-laws by a parent in one and the same week shall be deemed one offence; and that no penalty imposed for the breach of any Bye-law shall exceed such sum as with the costs will amount to five shillings for each offence.

VI. These Bye-laws shall take effect from and after the day on which the same shall be sanctioned by Her Majesty in Council.
