In the County Court of Cornwall, holden at Truro. In the Matter of Francis Holm, of Penryn, in the county of Cornwall, Shipwright, a Bankrupt.

George Vivian, of Penryn, in the county of Cornwall, Merchant, has been appointed Trustee of the property of the bankrupt.
