THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and shall cease

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 31st to have effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869, and the county of Middlesex means that county, except so much thereof as is in the Metropolis.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Cattle-Plague Order of 1877, or in any other Order of Council, the movement of cattle, sheep, and goats out of the county of Middlesex is hereby prohibited, except into the Metropolis.

3. Nothing in this Order shall restrict the moving of any cattle, sheep, or goats by railway through the county of Middlesex, or affect the operation of the provisions of The Metropolitan Cattle Plague Order of 1877.

4. If any cattle, sheep, or goats are moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person directing or permitting their removal, and the company or person removing or conveying them, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.
