THE Earl of Derby, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a report from the British Acting Consul at Smyrna, stating that some electric torpedoes have been laid at the entrance of the Bay of Smyrna.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day.

2. This Order may be cited as The Toning Order of 1877.

3. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1875.

4. Cattle brought from the port of Toning, in the German Empire, (in this Order referred to as Toning cattle,) are hereby excepted from the provisions described in the First Schedule to this Order as far as such exception is necessary for the operation of this Order, and, for the purposes of those provisions and of this Order, the port of Toning shall be deemed not to be in a country named in the Second Schedule to this Order.

5. Toning cattle may be landed in a defined part of the Port of London and not elsewhere.

6. (i.) The landing of Toning cattle shall be subject to the following conditions :

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within three months before taking them on board, had on board any cattle exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country named in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Second. That the vessel has not, since taking on board the cattle imported, entered any such port or place.

Third. That the cattle imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any such port or place.

(ii.) Those cattle shall not be landed unless and until—

(1.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in Great Britain, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions in relation to cattle to be landed under this Order from the vessel ; and

(2.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of cattle therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that none of the cattle then imported therein have been exported from a port or place in any country named in the Second Schedule to this Order, and that the foregoing conditions have been observed in relation to all the cattle then imported therein.

(iii.) In addition, the landing thereof shall be subject to the following conditions :

First. That the owner, agent, or charterer of the vessel in which they are brought has in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, received the special permission of the Privy Council to employ the vessel in the trade of importation of cattle under this Order.

Second. That the cattle imported are accompanied by a declaration and certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Third Schedule or to the like effect.

7. If an Inspector of the Privy Council is of opinion, on the examination of any cattle imported

under this Order, that the declaration accompanying them is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle in the vessel, then all the animals in the vessel shall be detained and dealt with in accordance with instructions from time to time given by the Privy Council.

8. If the declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order with respect to all the cattle to which the declaration relates, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices

before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge.

9. Every animal brought in the same vessel with Tanning cattle shall, if landed in Great Britain, be landed in a defined part of the port of London, and not elsewhere.

10. All provisions for the time being in force relative to animals in a defined part of the Port of London shall apply to animals being in that part under this Order.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, to Our Trusty and Well-Beloved William Calder Marshall, Esquire, Royal Academician; Greeting!

Whereas We did, by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the twenty-second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the fortieth year of Our reign, authorize and appoint Our Most Dear Son, Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Field-Marshal in Our Army, together with the several Noblemen and Gentlemen therein named, or any three or more of them, to be Our Commissioners to advise Us upon the best mode by which the products of Industry, Agriculture, and the Fine Arts of the United Kingdom, Our Colonies, and Dependencies, may be procured and sent to the Universal Exhibition of the Works of Industry and Agriculture, as well as of the Fine Arts, to be held at Paris, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the Second Class on:—

Acting Sub-Lieutenant ROBERT JAMES ARCHIBALD MONTGOMERIE, R.N., of Her Majesty's ship "Immortalité."

The following is an account of the Act in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

At 3.10 on the morning of the 6th April, 1877, the "Immortalité," being under all plain sail, moving $4\frac{1}{2}$ knots with the wind, two points abaft the starboard beam, the port gangway look-out reported a man overboard, who proved to be Thomas Hocken. Mr. MONTGOMERIE, who was on the bridge, working a star meridian altitude at the chart table, on hearing the cry, ran over to the lee side, saw the man in the water, and jumped after him. He made for Hocken, asking if he could swim, to which Hocken answered "Yes, sir," but did not seem to be moving vigorously. Mr. MONTGOMERIE then got hold of him, hauled him on his back, and towed him to where he (MONTGOMERIE) supposed the life-buoy would be, but seeing no relief, he told Hocken to keep himself afloat while he took his clothes off. While he was in the act of doing so, Hocken, evidently sinking, caught hold of him by the legs, and dragged him down a considerable depth. Mr. MONTGOMERIE, however, succeeded in getting clear, and swam to the surface, bringing the drowning man with him. Hocken was now insensible, and too great a weight to support any longer; and finding that his only chance of saving himself was to leave Hocken, Mr. MONTGOMERIE reluctantly gave up the hope of saving him, and struck out for the ship. In the meantime the ship's course was stopped, and two boats were lowered, by one of which Mr. MONTGOMERIE was picked up. The latitudes in which the occurrence took place abound with sharks; and though there was a half-moon, the sea was sufficiently disturbed to render small objects, even boats, difficult to discern. Had not Mr. MONTGOMERIE been a most powerful swimmer, he would have had little chance of life.

Railway No. 2, one mile three furlongs and forty-five yards in length, commencing in the township of Potternewton, in the said West Riding, by a junction with Railway No. 1, and terminating in the township of Templenewsam, in the parish of Whitkirk, by a junction with the Leeds and Selby Line of the North Eastern Railway Company at Osmondthorpe.

And it was also provided that Railway No. 1 should commence on the east side of North-street, in Leeds, instead of on the east side of Briggate, as shown on the plans and sections deposited in respect of the said Act.

Provided that, until the said sum has been repaid to the depositors, or has become otherwise applicable as hereinbefore mentioned, any interest or dividends accruing thereon shall from time to time, and as often as the same shall become payable, be paid to or on the application of the person or persons, or the majority of the persons named in such warrant or order as aforesaid, or the survivors or survivor of them.”

And whereas by the Leeds, Roundhay Park, and Osmondthorpe Junction Railway (Abandonment) Act, 1877, the Company is authorized and required to abandon the making of the said railways, and it is by that Act (sections 3, 4, 5, and 6), enacted as follows:—

“3. The abandonment by the Company, under the authority of this Act, of the railways shall not prejudice or affect the right of the owner or occupier of any land to receive compensation for any damage occasioned by the entry of the Company on such land for the purpose of surveying and taking levels or probing or boring to ascertain the nature of the soil, or setting out of the line of railway, and shall not prejudice or affect the right of the owner or occupier of any land which may have been temporarily occupied by the Company to receive compensation for such temporary occupation, or for any loss, damage, or injury which may have been sustained by such owner or occupier by reason thereof, or of the exercise as regards such land of any of the powers contained in the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or the Leeds, Roundhay Park, and Osmondthorpe Junction Railway Act, 1874.”

"5. Immediately upon the passing of this Act, section 28 of the Leeds, Roundhay Park, and Osmondthorpe Junction Railway Act, 1874, is by this Act repealed."

"6. Subject to the provisions of section 29 of the Leeds, Roundhay Park, and Osmondthorpe Junction Railway Act, 1874, the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, at any time after the passing of this Act, on the application of the person named in the Warrant or Order mentioned in section 28 of the said Act of 1874, or the executors or administrators of such person, by petition in a summary way, may and shall order that the sum of eight thousand six hundred and nine pounds four shillings and eight pence Three Pounds per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities mentioned in the said section 28, and the interest or dividends (if any) on that sum, shall be transferred and paid to the person or persons so applying, or to any other person or persons whom he or they may appoint in that behalf, and, on such order being made, the said sum and the interest or dividends thereon shall be transferred and paid to such person or persons accordingly."
