TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office of the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 3rd proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £1,639,000 (one million six hundred and thirty-nine thousand pounds).

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 9th proximo, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 9th October or 9th January next, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount, per cent., which will be given for the amounts applied for.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 4th proximo, and payment in full, of the amounts of the accepted Tenders, must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve at noon, on Monday, the 9th proximo.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, that he has granted a Certificate under the Industrial Schools Acts for the transfer of the Girl's Branch of the York Industrial School to new premises at Monkgate, in the city of York.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 39th and 40th years of Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the preservation of Wild Fowl," it was by the 2nd section provided that any person who shall kill, wound, or take, or attempt to kill, wound, or take, any wild fowl as defined by the said Act, or use any boat, gun, net, or other engine or instrument for the purpose of killing, wounding, or taking any wild fowl, or shall have in his control or possession any wild fowl recently killed, wounded, or taken, between the 15th day of February and the 10th day of July, in any year shall be liable to the penalty therein mentioned, and by the 3rd section, power was given to the Home Office as to Great Britain, upon application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order under the hand of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas on application of the Justices of the Peace for the county of Norfolk, I, by Order dated the 13th day of February, 1877, ordered to the effect that the time during which the killing, wounding, or taking of wild fowl is prohibited by the said Act, should, so far as relates to the killing, wounding, or taking of snipe only, in the county of Norfolk, be varied, so as to be from the 15th day of March up to and inclusive of the 10th day of July in each year:

And whereas since the making of the said Order, the Justices of the said county of Norfolk in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made rescinding the said Order of the 13th day of February, 1877, as to snipe, and directing that the time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl as defined by the said Act (inclusive of snipe), is prohibited shall be varied in the county of Norfolk so as to be from the 1st day of March up to and inclusive of the 10th day of July in each year.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

1. The said Order of the 13th day of February, 1877, as to snipe is hereby revoked.

2. The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild fowl, as defined by the said Act (inclusive of snipe), is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Norfolk so as to be from the 1st day of March up to and inclusive of the 10th day of July in each year.
