WHEREAS by Order in Council of the 30th day of April 1877, made in pursuance of the Bishopric of St. Albans Act, 1875, the Bishopric of St. Albans was constituted out of certain parts of the then diocese of Rochester :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, to order that there shall be transferred to the residue of the diocese of Rochester (remaining after such constitution as aforesaid of the Bishopric of St. Albans)

Firstly. All such parishes situate wholly or partly in the parliamentary divisions of East Surrey and Mid Surrey as now form part of the diocese of Winchester, with the exception of the parishes of Newdegate and Thames-Ditton, partly situate in the parliamentary division of Mid-Surrey :

Secondly. All such parishes situate in the county of Surrey as now form part of the diocese of London.

This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of August 1877.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such

"modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," it is, amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Exeter hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend Frederick Lord Bishop of Exeter do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the county of Devon, and my diocese of Exeter the vicarage of West Alvington which comprises the parish and mother church of West Alvington and the respective chapelries of South Milton, Malborough and South Huish the boundaries of which said parish and chapelries respectively are well known and defined.

"2. The parish of West Alvington as well as each of the said chapelries has its own church. The church of Malborough is distant from the mother church of West Alvington three miles and a half or thereabouts and from the church of South Huish about one mile and a half and the church of South Huish is distant from the said mother church five miles or thereabouts.

"3. According to the last census the population of the said parish and chapelries respectively is as follows, namely:—West Alvington 996, South Milton 360, Malborough 579 and South Huish 354.

"4. The hamlet delineated in the map hereto annexed and therein coloured pink (hereinafter referred to as 'the said hamlet') is part of the parish of West Alvington and is situated at the southern extremity of the same parish at a distance of three and a half miles from the parish

church thereof and it adjoins the parish of Malborough and is within about two hundred yards from the parish church thereof. The population of the said hamlet is about 100.

"5. West Alvington is a separate parish for all civil purposes, as is also each of the said chapelries; and baptisms churchings marriages and burials have heretofore been and are now performed in the said churches respectively for the inhabitants of the said parish and chapelries respectively.

"6. The inhabitants of the said parish and chapelries respectively have from time immemorial resorted to the respective churches thereof repaired the same by rates levied in such parish and chapelries respectively, and elected from among themselves churchwardens, overseers and other parish officers for such parish and chapelries respectively.

"7. The said chapelries are in no way connected with the parish of West Alvington or with each other in respect to rates of any kind, nor are the inhabitants thereof entitled to any accommodation in the said mother church, nor are the inhabitants of West Alvington entitled as of right to accommodation in the churches of either of the said chapelries, nor are the inhabitants of either of the said chapelries entitled to accommodation in the church of the other of them, but it has been usual for the inhabitants of the parish of West Alvington residing in the said hamlet to resort to the parish church of Malborough.

"8. The gross annual value of the said vicarage of West Alvington is nine hundred and eleven pounds arising partly from rent-charges in lieu of tithes, partly from glebe and partly from surplice fees; and of such annual value the sum of three hundred and forty-six pounds per annum arises from rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of lands in the chapelry of Malborough and from glebe land in the same parish and ninety pounds per annum arises from rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of lands in the chapelry of South Huish.

"9. There is a fit house of residence within the said parish of West Alvington for the residence of the incumbent and there is also a fit house of residence belonging to the said vicarage in the chapelry of Malborough.

"10. The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Sarum are the patrons of the said vicarage of West Alvington with the said chapelries annexed.

"11. The Venerable Alfred Earle Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Totnes in the said diocese is the vicar of the said vicarage.

"12. It appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty cap. 106 and the second and third years of Her said Majesty cap. 49 the said chapelries of Malborough and South Huish together with the said hamlet may be advantageously separated from the mother church of West Alvington and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy.

"13. Pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament I have drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and now the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the incumbent of the said

benefice and of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Sarum the patrons of the same to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this eleventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"**SCHEME.**

"That the chapelries of Malborough and South Huish and the hamlet forming part of the parish of West Alvington which is delineated in the map hereto annexed and therein coloured pink and is bounded on the north partly by the parish of South Huish and partly by a road adjoining the same parish and leading into the turnpike-road from West Alvington to the village of Malborough on the south by the road leading from South Huish to Salcombe on the east by the said turnpike-road and on the west by the parish of South Huish be separated from the vicarage and mother church of West Alvington and be together constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of the perpetual curacy of Malborough and South Huish of which the church within the said chapelry of Malborough shall be the parish church and the church of the said chapelry of South Huish shall be deemed a parochial chapel annexed thereto but the inhabitants of the said chapelry of Malborough shall not be entitled to any sittings or accommodation in the said church of South Huish nor shall the inhabitants of the said chapelry of South Huish be entitled to any sittings or accommodation in the church of Malborough.

"That the inhabitants of the said hamlet shall resort to the parish church of Malborough as their parish church and shall be provided with sittings therein and the incumbent of West Alvington shall be discharged from all cure of souls within the said hamlet and the said chapelries of Malborough and South Huish.

"That the proposed separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of West Alvington and the incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That there shall be assigned and attached to the said separate parish and benefice of Malborough and South Huish the whole of the vicarial rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of land within the said parishes of Malborough and South Huish and all the glebe lands within the same parishes respectively together with the house of residence belonging to the said vicarage in Malborough aforesaid and the appurtenances belonging thereto which house shall be the house of residence for the incumbent of the said separate parish and benefice.

"That the whole of the vicarial rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of lands in the respective parishes of West Alvington and South Milton (including those payable in respect of lands in the said hamlet) and all the glebe lands within the same parishes of West Alvington and South Milton shall continue to belong to the said vicarage of West Alvington as so separated as aforesaid.

"That baptisms churchings marriages and burials and all other ecclesiastical offices shall as heretofore be performed in the said mother church of West Alvington and in the church of each of the said chapelries and that the fees for all such offices performed within the limits of the said parishes of West Alvington and South Milton as so separated as aforesaid and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the same parishes as so separated and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the vicarage of West Alvington as so separated and the fees for all such offices performed within the limits of the said hamlet and the said chapelries of Malborough and South Huish and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said hamlet and each of the same chapelries and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice (other than and except the vicarial rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of lands in the said hamlet which are to belong to the incumbent of West Alvington) shall belong to the incumbent of the said separate parish and benefice of Malborough and South Huish.

"That one moiety of the first fruits, tenths and other ecclesiastical dues and of the annual rent or sum of two pounds thirteen shillings and eight pence to the Custos and College of Vicars Choral of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter in Exeter now payable by the incumbent of West Alvington with the chapelries of Malborough South Milton and South Huish annexed shall continue payable by the incumbent of West Alvington as separated from the said hamlet and the chapelries of Malborough and South Huish and the other moiety thereof respectively shall be payable by the incumbent of the said separate parish and benefice of Malborough and South Huish.

"That churchwardens for the said parish of West Alvington as separated from the said hamlet shall be chosen by the inhabitants of the same parish as so separated and churchwardens for the said chapelries respectively shall continue to be chosen for the same respectively in the same manner as they are now by law appointed except that the inhabitants of the said hamlet shall be entitled to vote in the election of churchwardens for the said parish of Malborough.

"That the inhabitants of the parish of West Alvington as separated from the said hamlet shall continue liable to the maintenance of the parish church of the same parish and the inhabitants of the said hamlet shall cease to be liable for the same and the inhabitants of the parish of Malborough and the said hamlet shall be liable for the maintenance of the parish church of Malborough but shall not be liable for the maintenance of the parish church of South Huish and the inhabitants of each of the said chapelries of South Milton and South Huish shall respectively continue liable to the maintenance of the church of their own chapelry and the inhabitants of the said chapelry of South Huish shall not be liable to the maintenance of the parish church of Malborough.

"That from and after the proposed separation shall take effect the patronage of the said vicarage of West Alvington as so separated as aforesaid shall remain vested in and be for ever exercised by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Sarum (the patrons of the said vicarage of West Alvington with the said chapelries annexed) and their successors and the patronage of the said perpetual curacy of Malborough and South Huish shall be vested in the said Alfred Earle as Vicar of the said vicarage of West Alvington as so separated as aforesaid so

long as he shall remain such vicar and after his avoidance of the same vicarage the same patronage shall be vested in and for ever exercised by the said Dean and Chapter and their successors."

"We the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Sarum the patrons entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage and parish church of West Alvington with the chapelries of South Milton, Malborough and South Huish in case the same were now vacant and I the Venerable Alfred Earle Vicar of the same vicarage and parish church do hereby respectively signify our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the said chapelries of Malborough and South Huish and the hamlet in the parish of West Alvington aforesaid from the said vicarage and parish church of West Alvington and chapel of South Milton, and for constituting the said two chapelries and hamlet a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"In witness whereof we the said Dean and Chapter have caused our common seal to be hereunto affixed and I the said Alfred Earle have subscribed the same this eleventh day of May A.D. 1877.

And whereas the said Lord Bishop hath transmitted the said scheme to the said Lord Archbishop together with the said consents.

And whereas the said Lord Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the seventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven which report is in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Frederick Lord Bishop of Exeter has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That there is in the county of Devon and diocese of Exeter the vicarage of West Alvington which comprises the parish and mother church of West Alvington and the respective chapelries of South Milton Malborough and South Huish the boundaries of which said parish and chapelries respectively are well known and defined.

"That the parish of West Alvington as well as each of the said chapelries has its own church.

"That the hamlet delineated in the map annexed to the said representation and therein coloured pink (and which in the said representation and in this report is referred to as 'the said hamlet') is part of the parish of West Alvington and is situate at the southern extremity of the said parish at a distance of three and a half miles from the parish church thereof and it adjoins the said chapelry and parish of Malborough and is within about two hundred yards of the church thereof.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelries of Malborough and South Huish together with the said hamlet may be advantageously separated from the said parish of West Alvington and be constituted a separate

parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy.

"That the said Lord Bishop has prepared a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbent of the said benefice has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventeenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James situate in the township of Wrightington within the limits of the parish of Eccleston in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint James situate in the township of Wrightington as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Man-

chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Eccleston which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint James situate in the township of Wrightington as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James Wrightington.'

"And with the like consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint James, Wrightington being:—

"All that part of the parish of Eccleston in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the east partly by the new parish of Charnock Richard partly by the new parish of Coppull and partly by the parish of Standish all in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the south-east by the district of Shevington in the same county and diocese on the south-west by the new parish of Douglas in the said county and diocese on the north-west and on the west by the new parish of Mawdesley in the same county and diocese and on the remaining side that is to say on the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Mawdesley from the parish of Eccleston aforesaid at the point on the western side of Halfpenny-lane where such lane bends sharply to the north-east and leaves the said boundary and extending thence for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts first north-eastward and then south-eastward to and along the middle of the said lane to its junction with Bibby's-lane and extending thence northward for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last named lane to the centre of the bridge which carries the same lane over the stream called or known as Howe Brook and extending thence generally southward for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to and along the middle of the said stream to the centre of the foot-bridge which carries the foot-path leading from Barmskin Hall to Town-lane and extending thence north-eastward for a distance

of twelve chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said footpath to its junction with Town-lane aforesaid and extending thence for a distance of fifty-two chains or thereabouts first northward and then eastward along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with the high road leading from Eccleston to Wigan which is at this point called or known as Wood-lane and extending thence southward for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-mentioned high road or lane to its junction with Chisnall-lane and extending thence eastward for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with Stock's-lane and with the footpath which leads across Syd Brook to the house called or known as 'Pembertons' and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of twelve and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-described footpath to the boundary on the south-western side of the said Syd Brook which boundary divides the said parish of Eccleston from the new parish of Charnock Richard aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirty-first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty seven have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the new parish of Earley in the diocese of Oxford, which said new parish some time formed part of that portion of the parish of Sonning which is in the county of Berks.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Earley which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed bearing date on or about the twenty-third day of February in

the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven made or expressed to be made under the authority of the New Parishes Acts 1843 1844 and 1856' or some or one of them and being under the hand and seal of Susanna Caroline Palmer of Holme Park in the said parish of Sonning Spinster and also under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners (which deed is intended to be inrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said Susanna Caroline Palmer did grant and confirm unto the incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed thereto in accordance with the provisions of the hereinafter first-mentioned Act as aforesaid and to his successors the incumbents thereof for the time being a clear yearly rent-charge or sum of two hundred pounds to be payable half-yearly on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all those parts and portions of the tithe rents - charge of two hundred and eighty pounds which by a certain tithe commutation award for the liberty of Earley in the said parish of Sonning were awarded and appointed in lieu of the rectorial or inappropriate tithes arising from lands within the said liberty the particulars of which parts or portions of rents-charge and of the lands and hereditaments out of which the same are now payable are set forth in the schedule annexed to the same deed.

"And whereas the said rent-charge or annual sum of two hundred pounds has been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition (inter alia) that (such arrangement appearing to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district and of the nomination of the incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend John Fielder Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Earley which is mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Bartholomew Earley.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Fielder Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Bartholomew Earley, being:—

"All that part of the new parish of Earley in the county of Berks and in the diocese of Oxford which is bounded on the east by the parish of Sonning situate partly in the said county of Berks partly in the county of Oxford and wholly in the diocese aforesaid on the north partly by the last-named parish and partly by the parish of Caversham in the said county of Oxford and in the diocese aforesaid or in other words by the River Thames on the north-west by the parish of Saint Lawrence Reading in the said county of Berks and in the diocese aforesaid or in other words by the River Kennet on the south-west partly by the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Reading and partly by the parish of Saint Giles Reading both in the last-named county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Giles Reading from the new parish of Earley aforesaid at a point in the middle of the western end of the road called or known as 'The New Road' and extending thence eastward for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of such road to its junction with the road called or known as 'The Eastern Avenue' and extending thence southward for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named road to its junction with Crescent-road and extending thence for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last-named road to its junction with Wokingham-road and extending thence north-westward for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named road to its junction with Clover-lane and extending thence eastward for a distance of forty-two and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said lane thereby crossing the line of the Reading Branch of the South-Eastern Railway to the point where the same lane joins Love-lane, and extending thence north-westward for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with the London-road and extending thence eastward for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named road to the boundary at or near to the junction of the same road with the road leading to Hurst which boundary divides the said new parish of Earley from the parish of Sonning aforesaid."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forth-

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order extends only to that part of the Metropolis which is situate North of the River Thames (in this Order referred to as the Northern part of the Metropolis); and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of Council, the movement of cattle within the Northern part of the Metropolis, is hereby prohibited, except as follows:

Cattle may be moved for immediate slaughter to the Metropolitan Cattle Market at Islington or to a slaughter-house within the Northern part of the Metropolis, with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority authorized to issue the same, and such licence shall be available for twelve hours and no longer: and in the case of cattle moved to a slaughter-house, the licence shall specify the slaughter-house to which they may be taken for slaughter, and they shall not be taken elsewhere.

Provided that no licence shall be given for the movement, and no licence shall be available for the movement, to the Metropolitan Cattle Market of cattle from a cow-house or shed in the Northern part of the Metropolis: and

Provided that no licence shall be necessary in the case of movement of cattle for a distance not exceeding five hundred yards from lands to other lands in the same occupation within the Northern part of the Metropolis.

3. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the provisions of The Metropolitan Cattle-Plague Order of 1877, or of the Order of the Privy Council, dated the second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

4. If any cattle are moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person directing or permitting their removal, and the company or person removing or conveying them, shall each be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.

BYE-LAWS and Regulations made by the Great Yarmouth Tramways Company Limited under the Powers conferred on the Company by "The Tramways Act, 1870," for preventing the commission of any Nuisance in or upon any Carriage, or in or against any Premises belonging to them, and for Regulating the Travelling in or upon any Carriage belonging to them:—

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. No passenger or other person shall smoke inside any carriage or waiting-room.

3. No passenger or other person shall, while in or upon any carriage or in any waiting-room, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

4. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage or to enter any waiting-room, and if found in or upon any carriage or in any waiting-room, shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other officer of the Company.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage or in any waiting-room, or commit any nuisance in, upon, or against any carriage or any waiting-room or other premises of the Company, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or intending passenger.

6. No person shall wilfully scratch, cut, tear, soil, or damage any carriage or the cushions, linings, or panels thereof, or remove or deface any number plate, table of fares, bye-laws, printed or other notice or writing, in or on any carriage or waiting-room, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage or waiting-room, or soil, deface, or damage the paint or paper, or the furniture or fittings of any waiting-room, or otherwise wilfully damage any property whatever of the Company. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation, shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay for any damage done.

7. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor or other officer of the Company, soil or injure the lining or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger or intending passenger, who, in the opinion of the conductor or other officer of the Company, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers or intending passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage or waiting-room, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage or waiting-room, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage or waiting-room after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or other officer, and if found in the interior of any carriage or waiting-room, shall, on the request of the conductor or other officer, leave the interior of the carriage or waiting-room upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

8. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do, to the conductor.

duly authorised servant of the Company, and shall, also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled or about to be travelled over by such passenger.

10. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

11. The personal luggage of each passenger, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and also the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, will be conveyed free of extra charge, but shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage, but the Company do not undertake to carry more than the specified weight, or any luggage, articles, or goods (except as above mentioned), in or upon carriages provided for passengers.

15. When a carriage contains a full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

16. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

17. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, or in any waiting-room, except by permission of the conductor or other officer of the Company, nor in any case in which the conveyance or admittance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage or waiting-room after having been requested by the conductor, or other officer of the Company, not to do so. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage, or into any waiting-room, in breach of this Regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge thereof, from the carriage or waiting-room immediately upon request, for the purpose, by the conductor or other officer of the Company, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other officer of the Company.

19. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded firearms, or with any combustible or dangerous substance or material.

20. No passenger or intending passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty in, upon, or in connection with any

carriage, tramway, waiting-room, or premises of the Company.

21. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability, and if any such conductor fails to do so, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
