THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs translations of two extracts from the Official Gazette of St. Petersburg, notifying the follow-

ing augmentations of Customs' duties on certain goods imported into Russia:—

The Customs' duty on tobacco in leaf and in bundles, with or without stalks, and on tobacco stalks, to be increased to 14 roubles per pound. The new duty to take effect from the date of publication (2nd July last) on all raw tobacco not previously entered at the Custom-houses.

The Customs' duty on pianos, pianinos, and organs not portable, excepting those used for church purposes, to be increased to 60 roubles each, and the duty on grand pianos and church organs to be raised to 100 roubles each. The new duties to take effect three months after the date of promulgation (7th July last).
