**THIS** day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to amend the laws relating to Game in Scotland.

An Act to give further facilities to landowners of limited interests in England and Wales and Ireland to charge their estates with the expenses of constructing reservoirs for the storage of water and other similar purposes.

An Act for the protection of the property of married women in Scotland.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Law of the Government of the United States of Colombia, opening the navigation of the River Magdalena, by the Ceniza Mouth, as far as the City and Custom-house of Barranquilla, to vessels engaged in the import trade, on condition that they shall have previously touched at another port of the Republic and obtained permission from the Custom-house there. The Law is not to come into operation, except as regards vessels laden with ice and timber, until the regulations under which the navigation is to be permitted shall have been issued, and for the preparation of which six months are given to the Executive Power.

BYE-LAWS and Regulations made by the Wirral Tramway Company Limited under the Powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage, or upon the platform.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage, shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation, shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof, or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.
