ORDER of Local Government Board Fixing Boundaries of Wards under Local Act :—

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Nottingham, in the county of Nottingham ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the "Nottingham Borough Extension Act, 1877," it is enacted that on and from the 1st day of November, 1877, the Borough of Nottingham as thereby extended shall be divided into Sixteen Wards, the names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries of which shall be fixed and determined by the Local Government Board on the report of a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by them within three weeks after the passing of that Act, and that the Commissioner shall make his report to the Local Government Board before the 1st day of August, 1877, and that such report shall be subject to revision by the Local Government Board, who shall make such Order therein as they think fit ;

And whereas it is thereby further enacted that the said Order shall be published before the 15th day of August, 1877, in the London Gazette, and in a newspaper circulating in the said Borough of Nottingham, and that on and from the 1st day of November, 1877, the names or numbers and boundaries of the Wards as set forth in such Order shall be the names or numbers and boundaries thereof for all purposes as if they had been specially set forth in the said Act ;

And whereas the said Act received the Royal assent on the 11th day of June, 1877 ; and on the 21st day of June, 1877, the Local Government Board appointed Gerald Augustus Robert Fitzgerald, of Great Queen-street, in the county of Middlesex, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be the Commissioner for the purpose above-mentioned ; and the said Commissioner made his report to the Local Government Board before the 1st day of August, 1877, namely, on the 30th day of July, 1877 :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the report so made to us, do hereby, under the authority of the above-mentioned Act, and of the several other Statutes in that behalf, order that the Sixteen Wards into which the Borough of Nottingham, as extended by the said Act, is to be divided on and from the first day of November, 1877, shall be named respectively the Market Ward, the Saint Mary's Ward, the Byron Ward, the Saint Ann's Ward, the Robin Hood Ward, the Forest Ward, the Sherwood Ward, the Castle Ward, the Meadows Ward, the Bridge Ward, the Trent Ward, the Manvers Ward, the Mapperley Ward, the Broxtowe Ward, the Saint Alban's Ward, and the Wollaton Ward, and that the boundaries of the said Wards respectively shall be those set forth in the schedule to this Order.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

MARKET WARD.—The boundary of the Market Ward shall be as follows :—

An imaginary line commencing at the south-west end of Grey Friars-gate, and continued thence in a direction generally northerly along the centre of Grey Friars-gate, of Lister-gate, of Low-pavement, of Bridlesmith-gate, of High-street, and of Clumber-street ; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Upper Parliament-street to a point opposite the centre of Market-street ; thence to the east end of Wollaton-street ; thence along the centre of Wollaton-street to the public weighing-

machine at Sion-hill ; thence in a south-westerly direction to the north-west end of Ropewalk-street ; thence in a south-easterly direction along the existing boundary of Saint Mary's parish in Ropewalk-street to Park-row ; thence along the existing boundary of Saint Nicholas' parish, crossing the grounds of the General Hospital, to the Hollows ; thence along the existing boundary of the same parish in the Hollows, in Castle-place, and in Castle-road, to the River Leen ; thence along the existing boundary of the same parish in an easterly direction ; and thence in a straight line to the point of commencement at the south-west end of Grey Friars-gate.
