THE following is a copy of the Treaty concluded by Captain G. L. Sullivan, of Her Majesty's ship "Sirius," and the King of Dahomey, at Whydah, on the 12th of May, 1877:—

TREATY WITH DAHOMEY.

TREATY between Captain George Lydiard Sullivan, of the Royal Navy, commanding Her Majesty's ship "Sirius", on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and Empress of India, and the Avogah of Dahomey, Satchloca, the second Avogah of Dahomey, Chodatong, on behalf of Gelele, King of Dahomey.

ARTICLE I.

It is agreed that there shall be henceforth peace and friendship between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty Gelele, of Dahomey, in Africa, and their heirs and successors.

ARTICLE II.

There shall be to the subjects of Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and Empress of India, complete liberty of commerce, and they shall have entire right and liberty to come with their ships and cargoes to all places and ports in the dominions of His Majesty Gelele, to reside and trade in any part of the said dominions, to hire, occupy, and possess any houses or warehouses for the purpose of commerce, and enjoy the most complete protection and security from His Majesty the King of Dahomey, the Governors and people of his dominions.

ARTICLE III.

The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty being or residing or trading in the country of Dahomey shall receive special protection from all annoyance and inconvenience in their various occupations or trades from any and all of the subjects of His Majesty Gelele, and from foreigners residing in that country, and they shall be permitted to hoist on their houses and factories a flag of the Kingdom of Dahomey alone, or in concert with the flag of England; and the King Gelele engages herewith to issue a proclamation to His Majesty's subjects, and to all foreigners in his dominions, never again to molest, interfere with, or threaten

the lives or persons of British subjects, on pain of severe punishment.

ARTICLE IV.

The export of slaves to foreign countries is for ever abolished in the territories of the King of Dahomey, and the Law made and proclaimed in accordance with a former Treaty between Her Majesty the Queen of England and King Gezo of Dahomey, dated January 13th, 1852, shall continue in force for ever.

ARTICLE V.

No British subject shall henceforth be compelled to attend any of the customs of the country of Dahomey where any human sacrifices are held.

ARTICLE VI.

Whereas, in consequence of insult and violence towards one of Her Majesty's subjects in the country of Dahomey, a fine has been imposed of 500 puncheons of oil on that kingdom, and a blockade established to enforce payment of the same, it is herein agreed, on the part of Her Most Gracious Majesty, that the fine shall be reduced to 400 puncheons of oil and the blockade immediately raised, under the following conditions: that 200 puncheons of oil are paid at once, and the remainder within twelve months from this date; and His Majesty King Gelele agrees to these conditions, and promises herewith to complete the payment of the 400 puncheons of oil by the time given.

THE Earl of Derby, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople the following telegram relative to merchant vessels passing through the Bosphorus to the Black Sea :—

"To ensure efficiency of its means for prevention of trade in contraband of war, the Porte has decided that merchant vessels, passing through the Bosphorus to the Black Sea, must hand to the Captain of the Port of Anatoli Kavak the Firman with which they must be provided for the passage of the straits. Every vessel infringing this order will be stopped by the forts."

The **QUEEN'S** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in a session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting the Office of County Coroner" it is (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the Justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act or that alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act it shall be lawful for the said Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled to resolve that a Petition shall be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division be made and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such Petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such county as therein-after provided and further that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such county and of the time when the Petition shall be taken by the said Justices into consideration and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such Petition having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed District the number of the inhabitants the nature of their employments and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act. And that such Petition with a description of the several proposed Districts and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the Petition is founded shall be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such Petition shall have been agreed to and that the Clerk of the Peace for such county shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such Petition certified under his hand to every Coroner for each county. And further that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty if She shall think fit with the advice of Her Privy Council after taking into consideration any such Petition and also any Petition which may be presented to Her by any Coroner of the same county concerning any such proposed division or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ De Coronatore Eligendo for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such county to Order that such county shall be divided into such and so

many Districts for the purposes of that Act as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid shall seem expedient and to give a name to each of such districts and to determine at what place within each district the Court for the Election of Coroner for such district should be holden as therein-after provided and every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette. And whereas by a Petition of the Justices of the Peace for the county of Kent assembled at Maidstone in the said county on the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven it was represented to Her Majesty that there were and had been for many years five Coroners for the said county, that each of such Coroners had been in the habit of holding inquests within a certain district or part of the said county; that when an Election for Coroners took place great inconvenience and great and unnecessary expence resulted from having Freeholders to attend from all parts of the said county, that it would be desirable that the election of a Coroner acting in any particular district should be confined to the Freeholders of such district; that the same could not be done unless the said county were divided into districts for that purpose pursuant to the said Statute 7th and 8th Victoria cap. 92 that at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county holden at Maidstone on the ninth day of January A.D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven it seemed expedient to the Justices then assembled for the reasons above-mentioned that the said county should be divided into such districts for the purposes aforesaid; and it was resolved that a Petition should be presented to Her Majesty praying that the said county might be divided into five districts for the purposes of the said Act, that the further consideration of the said Resolution was then adjourned to the tenth day of April then next; that the Clerk of the Peace of the said county pursuant to the said Statute did give notice of the said Resolution to every Coroner of the county and of the time and place when and where the said Petition would be taken into consideration; and that at such time and place so appointed none of the Coroners of the said county attended to confer with the said Justices and the said Justices thereupon adjourned the consideration of the said matter to the then next General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county and in the meantime the said Justices conferred with the said Coroners as to the said Districts.

And whereas by the said Petition certified to Her Majesty by the hands and seals of two of the Justices present when the same was agreed to the said Justices humbly prayed that Her Majesty with the advice of Her Privy Council would be pleased to issue an Order directing that the said county should be divided into the five Districts therein-after described for the purpose of electing Coroners. And the said Petition did contain a description of the several proposed Districts and of the boundaries thereof.

And whereas no Petition has been presented to Her Majesty by any Coroner of the said county concerning the said proposed division.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council having taken the said Petition into consideration is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to grant the prayer thereof and to declare order and determine.

That alteration shall be made of the division heretofore made of the said county of Kent under the Act passed in a Session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to amend the law re-

specting the office of County Coroner" in the following respects—

And for your assistance in the execution of this Our Commission, We have made choice of Our trusty and well-beloved George Edward March, Esq., to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and to attend you, whose services and assistance We require to use from time to time as occasion may require.

"The European Commission of the Danube adopts, from the 1st of January, 1878, in its entirety, the system of tonnage measurement recommended by the International Commission of Constantinople, and put in practice for the passage of the Suez Canal.

"From the 1st of January, 1878, the reduction of 3 per cent. of taxation allowed to steam vessels with fixed bunkers, and the surtax of 11 per cent. charged on vessels measured according to paragraph A, Clause XXIII, of

the Merchant Shipping Act of 1854, shall be alike suppressed, and every steam vessel which shall not present a special certificate indicating that her tonnage has been calculated according to the system above mentioned, shall be measured at Sulina by the Navigation Cash Office for the purpose of ascertaining the taxable tonnage."
