THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Bagdad, announcing that the export of grain and provisions from Turkish Arabia has been prohibited by the Ottoman Government. TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 4th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act, 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £3,000,000 (three million pounds.)

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 9th proximo, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz. ;—on the 9th January or 9th April next, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent., which will be given for the amounts applied for.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Friday, the 5th proximo, and payment in full, of the amounts of the accepted Tenders, must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve at noon, on Tuesday, the 9th proximo.

ORDER of the Local Government Board fixing Boundaries of Wards under Local Act :—

Borough of Derby.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Derby, in the county of Derby ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the "Derby Corporation Act, 1877," it is enacted that on and from the 1st day of November, 1877, the borough of Derby as thereby extended shall be divided into Eight Wards, the names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries of which shall be fixed and determined by the Local Government Board upon the report of a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by them within three weeks after the passing of that Act, and that the Commissioner shall make his report to the Local Government Board before the 1st day of September, 1877, and that such report shall be subject to revision by the Local Government Board, who shall make such Order therein as they think fit ;

And whereas it is thereby further enacted that the said Order shall be published before the last day of September, 1877, in the London Gazette, and in a newspaper circulating in the said borough, and that on and from the 1st day of November, 1877, the names or numbers and boundaries of the Wards as set forth in such Order shall be the names or numbers and boundaries thereof for all purposes as if they had been specially set forth in the said Act, and the boundaries of the Wards as set forth in such Order shall be shown upon a plan of the Wards signed in duplicate by the Principal Secretary to the Local Government Board, and deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, and with the Town Clerk at his office, within three weeks after the publication of the said Order;

And whereas the said Act received the Royal Assent on the 23rd day of July, 1877; and on the 31st day of July, 1877, the Local Government Board appointed Gerald Augustus Robert FitzGerald, of Great Queen-street, in the county of Middlesex, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be the Commissioner for the purpose above-mentioned; and the said Commissioner made his report to the Local Government Board before the 1st day of September, 1877, namely, on the 17th day of August, 1877;

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the report so made to us, do hereby, under the authority of the above-mentioned Act, and of the several other Statutes in that behalf, order that the Eight Wards into which the borough of Derby, as extended by the said Act, is to be divided on and from the first day of November, 1877, shall be named respectively the Kings Mead Ward, the Derwent Ward, the Castle Ward, the Litchurch Ward, the Arboretum Ward, the Babington Ward, the Becket Ward, and the Friar Gate Ward, and that the boundaries of the said Wards respectively shall be those set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

KINGS MEAD WARD.—The boundary of the Kings Mead Ward shall be as follows:—

An imaginary line commencing at the point where Markeaton-lane intersects the boundary of the borough on its north-western side, continuing thence south-eastwardly along the centre of Markeaton-lane to its junction with Nuns-street; thence north-eastwardly along the centre of Nuns-street to the eastern parapet of the bridge over Markeaton Brook, situate in Nuns-street; thence south-eastwardly along the centre of Markeaton Brook to the point where Markeaton Brook passes under the Sadler-gate Bridge; thence south-westwardly along the centre of Cheapside to its junction with the Wardwick; thence south-eastwardly along the centre of the Wardwick and of Victoria-street to the junction of Victoria-street and Corn-market; thence northwardly along the centre of Corn-market, the western side of the Market-place, and the centre of Irongate, Queen-street, King-street, and Duffield-road, to the point where Duffield-road intersects the boundary of the borough near Darley Abbey; and thence westwardly and south-westwardly along the boundary of the borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.
