THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Monte Video, with copy of a Decree issued by the Provisional Government, removing the import duty on coal. The

capital represented by cargoes of coal imported will, nevertheless, be subject to the impost of property tax, the metrical ton of coal being valued at ten dollars.

A copy of a further Decree of the same Government has also been received, removing the export duties on agricultural and rural produce (including fresh meat and fish) and live cattle.
