A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of October, 1877.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

#### PRESENT:

Lord Chancellor. Lord President.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1875.

2. Notwithstanding anything in The Metropolitan Cattle-Plague Order of 1877, or The Metropolis (Movement) Order of August, 1877, goats exhibited at the Exhibition of Dairy Produce held at the Agricultural Hall, in the parish of Islington, in the Metropolis, in October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, may be moved out of the Exhibition and then out of the Metropolis in manner and subject to the conditions following—

(1.) There shall be a Licence of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis for the movement, which Licence shall be available

for 12 hours and no longer:

(2.) Such Licence shall only be granted on a Certificate of Health signed by a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, and a Certificate of the Secretary of the Exhibition of the goats having been exhibited in the Exhibition.

3. If any person or body does anything in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the

provisions of, this Order, such person or body shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked to the extent in that Schedule mentioned.

3. Nothing in this Order shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order, before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Act of 1869, or the said Order.

#### SCHEDULE.

The Order of Council of the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, prohibiting the landing in Great Britain of cattle brought from a port or place in Belgium or the German Empire, and of cattle, sheep, or goats being or having been on board a vessel at the same time with cattle so brought, and prohibiting (Article 3) the landing in Great Britain of certain articles brought from a port or place in Belgium or the German Empire.

So much of Article 3 of the Order as is in force.
