THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt, stating that in consequence of recent irregularities in the production of bills of health, the International Board of Health have decided that all vessels arriving in Egypt from a suspected port without a bill of health and without a surgeon on board will be subjected to a quarantine of observation of three full days, if the voyage has not extended over nine days, and if no suspicious case of illness has occurred on board.

### (1.) *Intended Alteration in Hohe Weg High Light.*

THE German Government has given notice, that on and after 1st October, 1877, Hohe Weg High Light (fixed white), at present visible between the bearings of S.E. by E. to South, will be visible in all directions, except between the bearings of N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. and E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., through which portion of arc it will be obscured, and indicates the northern and southern limits of Hook Siel Flat, Jade River.

(No. 130.)—CHINA SEA—NATUNA ISLANDS.

(1.) *Sunken Danger between Great Natuna Island and Pulo Laut.*

INFORMATION has been received of the existence of a sunken danger  $5\frac{1}{2}$  miles south of Pulo Laut; about two miles north-westward of Louise Reef (on which the French ship "Louise et Marguerite" struck in 1873), and with which it is probably connected.

This danger (Gloria Reef), on which the Spanish steam-vessel "Gloria" was wrecked in May, 1877, is composed of coral and stones. From the wreck, lying in 15 feet water, the west extreme of Pulo Laut bore N.N.W.; and the south extreme of Semione Island W.S.W.

North-eastward of this position, at the distance of half a mile, the depth of 8 fathoms was found; Eastward, 3, 5, and 7 fathoms, at half, one, and two miles respectively; nearly midway between it and Louise Reef, 12 feet; on the south and south-west sides, 17 fathoms at the distance of about a mile; and N.N.W. 9 fathoms at the distance of two miles.

YANGTSE-KIANG RIVER—CHINKIANG.

(2.) *Fixed Light near Mud Fort Point.*

The Chinese Government has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a mast situated about 40 yards from the bank, and 500 yards westward of Mud Fort Point (eastward of Tsauhai Creek or Straw-shoe Channel), north bank of Yangtse-Kiang River.

ARCHIPELAGO.

(1.) *Sunken Danger off Kopah Inlet.*

THE Government of India has given notice of the existence of a sunken rock in the approach to Kopah Inlet:—

This danger (Richelieu Rock), awash at low water, and at times breaking heavily, lies 13 miles west of Hayes Island. Position as given, lat.  $9^{\circ} 20' 30''$  N., long.  $98^{\circ} 6' 45''$  E.

Bold Promontory, Sullivan Island, W. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.

North Gregory, S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.

Canister Islet, N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.

This danger has been noted on the charts as Marble Rock.

NOTE.—As Mergui Archipelago is only partially examined, and several rocks have recently been discovered, great caution is necessary in the navigation.

#### *Alterations in and Additional Lights in Hook of Holland Canal.*

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners No. 64 of 14th July, 1873, and No. 11 of 20th January, 1877, on the establishment of leading lights in the Hook of Holland Canal:

The Netherlands Government has given further notice of the following alterations in the positions of the leading lights; also, of the establishment of additional lights:—

1. The two fixed white leading lights exhibited from the sand hill on the south shore of the canal have been moved westward of their former positions; the upper light now bears S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., 288 yards from the lower light.

Position of upper light, lat.  $51^{\circ} 58' 25''$  N., long.  $4^{\circ} 6' 40''$  E.

These lights in line bearing S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., lead 109 yards south-westward of the Northern Mole Head, and to the position of white buoy No. 4.

2. Two leading lights are now exhibited on the north shore of the canal, near the Krimslot, eastward of the temporary harbour of refuge.

The lights are fixed red lights, 143 yards apart and bear from each other S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. and N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.

Position of western light, lat.  $51^{\circ} 58' 19''$  N., long.  $4^{\circ} 8' 10''$  E.

When the light on the centre of the South Mole bears S.W., these lights in line bearing S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. will lead through the Keel or Benedenmond (lower mouth), until off the eastern white leading light (Zanddyk) on the north shore of the canal.

3. The two fixed white leading lights on the north shore of the canal, near the refuge harbour, have been moved northward of their former positions; they now bear from each other N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. distant 295 yards.

Position of western light, lat.  $51^{\circ} 58' 35''$  N., long.  $4^{\circ} 7' 35''$  E.

These lights in line lead through the Bovenmond (upper mouth), north-westward of the Scheur, but at their point of intersection with the line of the red leading lights (2) the northern bank requires further cutting away before these marks can be used.

4. A fixed white light is now exhibited from the Northern Mole Head, when the state of the sea admits.

Position, lat.  $51^{\circ} 59' 10''$  N., long.  $4^{\circ} 5' 5''$  E.

5. The light on the centre of the South Mole showing as fixed red to seaward, changes to white within black buoy, No. 3.

6. The fixed red light on the south shore of the canal, near Scheur Mole, remains unaltered.

Position, lat.  $51^{\circ} 57' 25''$  N., long.  $4^{\circ} 9' 15''$  E.

These several white lights should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles, the red lights from about 4 miles.

#### *Alteration in Hellevoetsluis Light.*

#### *(1.) Night Signals shown by British Pilot Vessels.*

##### *Sunken Dangers off Point Delgada.*

THE Chilean Government has given notice of the existence of sunken dangers near Point Delgada:—

The German steam-vessel "Dendereh," after striking on a rock near this point, rapidly sunk and grounded on a reef in 3 fathoms water, half a cable from the shore in a westerly direction from the point.

The reef on which the ship grounded was steep-to, as 8½ fathoms was found 100 feet from it.

NOTE.—Point Delgada should be approached with caution, as these dangers are only distant about 1½ cables eastward of the fairway of the channel. Sarmiento Channel is now being surveyed by the Chilean authorities.
