"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Brandon aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (testified by his having signed and sealed time for the registration of trade marks used in this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical the textile industries should be extended beyond Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Brancepeth which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Brandon as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John

the Evangelist, Brandon.'

your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John the Fvangelist, Brandon, being:-

"All that part of the parish of Brancepeth in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the north partly by the parish or district of Esh and partly by the parish of Saint Oswald Durham both in the county and diocese aforesaid on the east by the last-named parish on the south-east and on the south partly by the new parish of Croxdale and partly by the parish of Tudhoe both in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the south-west and on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Tudhoe from the parish of Brancepeth aforesaid at the point where the River Wear is joined by the stream called or known as Nafferton Gill and where the boundary which divides the township of Tudhoe from the township of Brandon and Byshottles meets the boundary dividing the last named township from the township of Brancepeth and extending thence for a distance of about four and a quarter miles alternately north-westward and westward along the last-mentioned township boundary to the point on the northern side of Pithouse Plantation at Tallyho-Gate on the southern side of Pithouse-lane where the same township boundary diverges to the south from the said lane and extending thence first northward to and then westward for a distance of fourteen and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the same lane to its junction at or near to the north-western corner of the said Pithouse Plantation with the bridle road leading to Esh Colliery and extending thence north-west-ward, for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said bridle road to a point at the junction of the same bridle road with the tract of the Old Roman-road called
