WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John situate at Baxenden in the new parish of Christ Church, Accrington in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John, situate at Baxenden as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church, Accrington which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John situate at Baxenden as aforesaid and that

the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John Baxenden.'

"And with the like consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John situate at Baxenden as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Robert Nicholson Featherstone Clerk in Holy Orders, the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Christ Church, Accrington shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance, at the said church of Saint John situate at Baxenden as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Robert Nicholson Featherstone; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John Baxenden being:—

"All that part of the new parish of Christ Church Accrington in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the west partly by the new parish of Saint James Accrington and partly by the particular district of Oswaldtwistle both in the said county and diocese on the south and on the south-east by the parochial chapelry of Haslingden in the same county and diocese and on the remaining sides that is to say on the north and on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parochial chapelry

of Haslingden from the new parish of Christ Church Accrington aforesaid at a point in the Old Warmden Sandstone Quarry in the middle of the stream which flows through Warmden Clough to the Oak Print Works and extending thence westward for a distance of fifty-three chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said stream to its junction with the Warmden Clough Reservoir of the said Oak Print Works and continuing thence still westward along the southern bank of the said reservoir for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the point at the south-western corner thereof where the same stream issues from the said reservoir and extending thence south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby passing close by the south-eastern side of the house and buildings called or known as Laund, and crossing the foot road leading from the said Oak Print Works to Higher Laund and also crossing Manchester-road, the points at which the said two lastly mentioned roads are crossed being indicated by boundary stones inscribed respectively 'B. St. J. D. C. 1877, No. 1' and 'B. St. J. D. C. 1877, No. 2' and placed on the north-eastern sides of such roads respectively) to the point at or near to Lane-ends where Hollins-lane is joined by the occupation road leading to Laund House and continuing thence still south-westward for a distance of two and a half-chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said Hollins-lane to the point where it bends sharply to the south-east, such point being opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'B. St. J. D. C. 1877, No. 3' and placed on the south-western side of the same lane, and continuing thence that is from the last-mentioned point in the middle of the same lane, to the last-mentioned boundary stone, and extending thence still south-westward but in a more southerly direction, and in a straight line for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the mile post situate on the southern side of the line of the East Lancashire Railway and indicating a distance of twenty-one miles from Manchester, and continuing thence that is from the said mile post in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a further distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the stream called or known as Wood Nook Water which boundary divides the said new parish of Christ Church Accrington from the new parish of Saint James, Accrington aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty

chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Saint Albans in the county of Herts now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an indenture bearing date the twelfth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty made or expressed to be made between William Pennell therein described the official assignee and John Purrott therein described and William Langley therein described the creditors' assignees of the estate and effects of John Samuel Story therein described a bankrupt of the first part the said John Samuel Story of the second part Maria Hodge therein described of the third part Gordon Calthrop therein described of the fourth part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fifth part the messuage or tenement lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereto annexed with their appurtenances became (inter alia) and are now vested in us.

And whereas the said messuage or tenement lands and hereditaments are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession but some portions thereof on account of their character and situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said messuage or tenement lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such messuage or tenement lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign all or any of the said messuage or tenement lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent-charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in

the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE.

“All those the messuage or tenement lands hereditaments and premises which in the said indenture referred to in this scheme are particularly described and set forth as follows:—

“Firstly.—All that messuage or tenement with the offices gardens and premises thereto adjoining and belonging commonly known as the Abbey Orchard House situate in the parish of Saint Albans in the county of Herts formerly in the occupation of Peter Martineau Esquire then of the Reverend Marcus Richard Southwell lately of William Roberts Esquire deceased and now of Elizabeth Anne Roberts his widow. And also all that piece or parcel of land containing one acre and eight poles immediately adjoining the said messuage or tenement and hitherto forming part of a field or close of pasture land called or known by the name of the Abbey Orchard but recently staked off from the rest of the said field or close as the said messuage or tenement and premises are delineated in the map or plan drawn in the margin thereof and are therein coloured pink. And fourthly all that piece or parcel of meadow land situate between the pleasure ground in front of and belonging to the said Abbey Orchard House and the said piece or parcel of land so purchased by the said George Ashwell as aforesaid commonly called the Middle Abbey Orchard containing two acres one rood and thirty perches or thereabouts now or late in the occupation of the said John Samuel Story as the same is also delineated on the said plan and is therein coloured green. And also full and free right and liberty of way on foot and for horses carts and other carriages at all times for ever thereafter by along and through the private road or way of the width of fifteen feet throughout from Holywell Hill extending to the piece or parcel of ground hereinbefore fourthly described as the said private road or way is described and coloured brown on the same map or plan. And also the soil of the one moiety or half part of such private road or way immediately adjoining to the said firstly described piece of land containing one acre and eight poles subject nevertheless to the like right of way to and for the said William Pennell John Purrott and William Langley and their assigns in upon over and across the said road or way for the more convenient enjoyment of the said piece or parcel of land immediately adjoining on the south to the said road or way.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Saint Albans.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Deanery of Saint Davids in the Cathedral Church of Saint Davids, and now vested in us.

“Whereas under an Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of another Act of the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and by virtue of an Order of your Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the said Acts, and bearing date the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and duly published in the London Gazette on the eighth day of the same month, certain manors lands and other hereditaments, excepting any right of patronage, described in the schedule referred to in the said Order, then belonging to or forming part of the endowment of the said deanery, became absolutely vested in us, for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

“And whereas a portion of the property which became so vested in us as aforesaid is now in our possession we having effected the purchase of the leasehold interest therein and the remainder consists of reversions expectant upon beneficial leases granted for lives and produces during the subsistence of such leases only a small annual revenue and on that account, and partly on account of the character and situation of the property, the same is unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

“And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said manors lands and other hereditaments, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said manors lands and other hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

“Now therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell

or dispose of, and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, with the consent of the holder or holders thereof (if any) to be testified by his, her, or their being made parties to such instruments, all or any of the said manors lands and other hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances, and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his her or their heirs executors administrators or assigns, or otherwise as he, she, or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable; it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes, rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock, or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

"All that the manor or lordship of Scampton in the county of Lincoln with the rights royalties members and appurtenances thereto belonging. And also all and singular the messuages farms lands tenements and hereditaments situate lying and being in the parish of Scampton in the county of Lincoln aforesaid containing together two thousand one hundred and forty-six acres and

eleven perches or thereabouts the particulars whereof are set forth in the schedule annexed to the indenture referred to in this scheme the whole thereof comprising the entire parish of Scampton with the exception of the church and churchyard and glebe and which said lands and hereditaments for the better identification thereof but not by way of restriction or limitation are delineated and described in the plan drawn on the front skin of the said indenture and are thereon coloured pink. And all houses outhouses homesteads cottages buildings lands covered with water rivers wastes feedings commons mines minerals customs tithes trees woods fences ways waters watercourses rents franchises liberties privileges easements profits advantages rights members and appurtenances to the said manor or lordship messuages farms lands and hereditaments or any part or parts thereof belonging or in anywise appertaining."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (which said church and cure are hereinafter called the said benefice) of Saint Mary Truro in the city and diocese of Truro.

"Whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary Truro is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession in the Reverend Clement Fox Harvey Clerk in Holy Orders now rector or incumbent of the benefice of Saint Mary Truro and his heirs and assigns.

"And whereas a sum of one hundred pounds sterling has been paid over to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in augmentation of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint Mary Truro upon the understanding and condition (amongst other things) that a transfer of the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint

Mary Truro from the said Clement Fox Harvey and his heirs and assigns to the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Truro should be effected as is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward White now Bishop of the said diocese of Truro is willing to accept for himself and his successors in the bishoprick of Truro the said proposed transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas it appears to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England that the transfer of the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary Truro which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Saint Mary Truro being the parish or district in or in respect of which the said advowson and right of patronage and presentation arises and exists.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Clement Fox Harvey (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary Truro now vested in the said Clement Fox Harvey and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid shall be transferred from the said Clement Fox Harvey and from his heirs and assigns to the said Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro as such Bishop and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward White Bishop of the said diocese of Truro and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Truro.

And whereas the said Statute has been this day laid before Her Majesty in Council, the same is published in the London Gazette, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

And notice is hereby given, that it is lawful for the bodies or persons authorized so to do, in that Act, within two months from the date of the publication of this notification, to petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of such Statute.

STATUTE A.

- I. This Statute shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by Her Majesty in Council.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING TEMPORARY COPYISTS IN PUBLIC DEPARTMENTS.

* * * Revised Regulations may at any time be issued, which will apply to every Copyist who may accept or renew an engagement after their publication in the London Gazette.

Civil Service Commission,

January, 21, 1878.

1. A Register of Copyists for temporary em-

ployment in Public Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. This register will contain the names—

(a.) Of Candidates who, after the ordinary competitions, have been placed on the list of successful competitors for Clerkships of the Lower Division, or for situations of Assistants of Excise, but have not yet received appointments, *provided they signify their wish to the Civil Service Commissioners to be provisionally registered as Copyists.*

Men Clerks can only be registered as Men Copyists and Boy Clerks as Boy Copyists.

The appointment to permanent situations of Candidates thus provisionally placed on the Register of Copyists will, in the case of Clerks of the Lower Division, continue to take effect according to Clause 9 of the Order in Council of 12 February, 1876.

While they remain upon the Register they will be subject to whatever regulations apply to other Registered Copyists.

(b.) Of Candidates who, not having competed for Clerkships of the Lower Division, or for situations of Assistants of Excise, or not being placed on the lists of successful Competitors, have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that they are of good health and character, and that they are duly qualified under the following regulations (3 and 4).

3. The limits of age in the case of Candidates not belonging to class (a) are:—

For Men Copyists,—over 18.

For Boy Copyists,—14 to 18.

4. The subjects of examination for Candidates in Class 2 (b), are:—

MEN COPYISTS:

OBLIGATORY.*

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Copying Manuscript.
4. Copying Figures and Tabular Statements.

OPTIONAL.

5. Arithmetic.

BOY COPYISTS:

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography,
3. Elementary Arithmetic.

5. Examinations, for the purpose of testing the qualifications of Candidates in the above-mentioned subjects, will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners from time to time as may be necessary, and a certain number, regulated by the probable demand from the Public Departments, of those who display the requisite amount of proficiency, will be placed upon the Register kept by the Commissioners.

6. The fee payable by persons attending these examinations will be 5s. for men, and 2s. 6d. for boys.

7. Registered Copyists will be summoned for employment in any of the Public Departments as they are wanted. When not wanted, they will have no claim to employment. Refusing to serve when called upon, except for reasons satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, they will be

* Candidates should fully understand that only those who show themselves proficient in the obligatory subjects can be placed upon the Register, and that those who do not pass in arithmetic will be excluded from employment where Copyists are required for arithmetical work.

removed from the Register. The order in which they may be employed, the Departments to which they may be assigned, and their retention generally on the Register, will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners; but they will be subject to the orders of the Departments in which they are serving during the time of their actual employment, and will be liable to dismissal from them by the authorities thereof, without notice, for inefficiency or misconduct.

8. Copyists may be engaged by the hour, day, or week, or by the piece. The engagement of all Copyists, not engaged for a shorter period, will be by the week. Copyists engaged for a day or upwards will ordinarily be employed for the number of hours constituting the official day in the Department to which they are attached, but if they are required to give their services after official hours, they must do so, and they will be paid at the same rate, whether by the hour or by the piece, as in the official hours. A Copyist refusing to work after official hours on these terms without an excuse satisfactory to the authorities of the Department will be liable to dismissal by them without notice.

9. Men Copyists will be paid either at the rate of 10d. per hour, or at the rate of 1½d. for every 100 words well and correctly copied, as the authorities of the Department for which they are required may determine. Other rates for special kinds of work may be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the previous approval of the Commissioners of the Treasury; but Copyists, as a rule, are not meant to be employed upon any work except mere copying, or routine work, under the direct supervision of established officers.

10. No service, however much it may happen to be prolonged, will confer any claim to superannuation or compensation allowance.

11. The pay of Boy Copyists will commence at the rate of 4d. per hour; an addition of ½d. per hour may be allowed by the Civil Service Commissioners at the end of each year of approved service. Should any Boy Copyists be engaged by the piece they will be paid at such rates as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury. Boy Copyists will not be retained, as such, after they shall have reached the age of 19.

12. If a public holiday, on which the office is closed, fall within the period of a Copyist's engagement, he may be paid in respect of it as for a working day. Copyists may, with the consent of the Department in which they are serving, or, if not at the time serving, with the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners, be allowed holidays, with pay, at the rate for the official day, in the proportion of one day for every 24 full days of actual and approved service previously rendered by them as registered Copyist. No Copyist shall be allowed to take more than twelve days' leave under these conditions, between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of December, both days inclusive, in any one year. In calculating the leave to be allowed in any given year, no service shall be counted before the 1st day of January of the preceding year.

13. Copyists who may fall ill while serving in any Department, and whose illness may be attested by medical certificate to the satisfaction of the authorities of such Department, may be allowed sick-leave, receiving three-fourths of the rate of pay for the official day; provided such Copyists have been borne on the Register one year or upwards, and provided that no Copyist shall be paid for holidays and sick-leave, taken together,

for more than 28 days within any one year exclusive of public holidays.

14. Except in conformity with Regulations 11 and 12, Copyists will only receive pay for the hours, or parts of hours, during which they actually attend.

15. No person who has been trained, either wholly or partially, at the public expense, for the occupation of a teacher in schools in connection with the Committee of Council for Education, or the Board of National Education, Ireland, is eligible for employment as a Copyist, until the consent of those Departments, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners. Persons employed in any branch of the Public Service whether Civil, Naval, or Military, will not be eligible unless they shall have produced to the Civil Service Commissioners at or before the time of examination the written consent of the authorities under whom they may be serving.

16. Copyists are not intended to travel during an engagement, nor will they, as a rule, be required to accept engagements at a distance from their residence; but any Copyist who may be ordered to travel, will be allowed such reasonable and customary expenses as the Lords of the Treasury may in each case approve.
