been regularly thrice performed on each and every Sunday during the quarter of the year then ended within the united parishes of Sibertswold and Coldred aforesaid: Provided also, that the said yearly sum or stipend of seventy pounds, expressed to be hereby granted, shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu of, and in full substitution for, the yearly sum or stipend of the same amount, heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners (subject to certain conditions), to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarages of Sibertswold and Coldred, under the authority of another instrument sealed by us on the seventh day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and published in the London Gazette of the fifteenth day of the same month and year: And provided further, that the said yearly sum or stipend of seventy pounds hereby granted shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said parishes and vicarages of Sibertswold and Coldred.
