

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Burford-with-Fulbrook, in the county of Oxford, and in the diocese of Oxford, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the tenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and to be receivable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days in each and every year of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford, that an Assistant-Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the parishes of Burford and Fulbrook aforesaid during the quarter of the year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said parishes and vicarages of Burford-with-Fulbrook.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Bramford-with-Burstable, in the county of Suffolk, and in the diocese of Norwich, one capital sum of eighty-two pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing stables and other outbuildings in connection with the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Bramford-with-Burstable.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of benefaction, consisting of a sum of one thousand three hundred and thirty-five pounds, five pounds per centum debenture stock of the Great Western Railway Company, which has been transferred into our name in the books of the same Company for the benefit of the Incumbent for the time being of the district chapelry and vicarage of Saint John the Evangelist, North Woolwich, in the counties of Essex and Kent, and in the diocese of Saint
