NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Saturday, the 9th of February next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty:

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations should be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united or which may be hereafter united under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things, enacted, "That when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall enquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united

"benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such diocese, immediately, on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Lincoln on the eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five made a representation to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words following.

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Bole and the rectory of South Wheatley in the county of Nottingham and diocese of Lincoln by the separation of the rectory of South Wheatley from the vicarage of Bole may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"Witness my hand the eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five."

And whereas the said Archbishop did thereupon enquire into the circumstances of the case and on such enquiry it appeared to him that the said union might be usefully dissolved and the said Archbishop did thereupon six weeks at least before certifying such enquiry to Her Majesty as in the said Act directed cause a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on the principal outer door of the church in each of the benefices forming part of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion. And whereas no sufficient cause was shown within the period limited by the said Act, and the patrons of the said united benefice consented to the proposed disunion, and the said Archbishop did thereupon

certify the enquiry and consent to Her Majesty in Council in the words following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council that the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which is situated the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Bole and the rectory of South Wheatley in the county of Nottingham having represented unto us that the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the said rectory of South Wheatley from the said vicarage of Bole might be made with advantage to the interests of religion we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved.

"That the said Lord Bishop and the Right Reverend James Lord Bishop of Manchester are the patrons alternately of the said united benefice by virtue of their respective bishopricks and are consenting to the proposed disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the said representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the reply thereto, the consents in writing of the respective patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consents aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for separating the said rectory of South Wheatley from the said vicarage of Bole and for declaring that from and after such disunion and separation of the said two benefices the patronage of each benefice shall be vested in the Bishops of Lincoln and Manchester for the time being and shall be exercised by them in an alternate course or succession for ever and that the first turn to present to each of the said benefices shall belong to the Lord Bishop of Manchester for the time being.

"As witness our hand this ninth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and doth hereby order that the said rectory of South Wheatley shall be disunited and separated from the said vicarage of Bole.

And Her Majesty is pleased to declare that from and after such disunion and separation of the said two benefices the patronage of each benefice shall be vested in the Bishops of Lincoln and Manchester for the time being and shall be exercised by them in an alternate course or succession for ever, and that the first turn to present to each of the said benefices shall belong to the Lord Bishop of Manchester for the time being.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united or which may be hereafter united under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things, enacted, "That when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall enquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion: and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited

"without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And whereas by the same Act of the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty it is amongst other things also enacted "that whenever two or more benefices which have at any time been united into one benefice shall be disunited and become separate benefices under the provisions of this Act it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province with the consent of the patron or patrons of such benefices respectively (such consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons), to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such benefices respectively, as to Her Majesty in Council shall seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe land, tithes rent-charges, moduses or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole united benefice."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Lincoln on the eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five made a representation to the Archbishop of Canterbury in the words following:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of North Wheatley and the rectory of Saundby in the county of Nottingham and diocese of Lincoln by the separation of the rectory of Saundby from the vicarage of North Wheatley may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"Witness my hand the eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

"C. Lincoln.

And whereas the said Archbishop did thereupon inquire into the circumstances of the case and the said Bishop did thereupon send to the said Archbishop a statement of circumstances and consent of patron in which it was among other things stated as follows: That it is proposed that in case the separation of the said rectory of Saundby from the said vicarage of North Wheatley shall be carried into effect by an Order of Her Majesty in Council it shall be provided by such Order in Council that all and singular the tithe rent-charges and other payments or compositions in lieu of tithes and all the glebe lands and other endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the said vicarage and parish of North Wheatley shall continue to belong to the vicar of the said vicarage and that by the same Order in Council there shall be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley

the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said united benefice of North Wheatley with Saundby and situate at North Wheatley aforesaid and that by the same Order in Council the yearly rent-charge in lieu of tithes belonging to the rectory of Saundby and amounting to £326 6s. 1d. shall be divided and apportioned so that there be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley the rent-charge of £155 10s. 2d. arising from the lands specified in the schedule hereunder written. And that it shall be provided by the said Order in Council that the remainder of the said rent-charge of £326 6s. 1d. amounting to £170 15s. 11d. and all other (if any) tithe rent charges, glebe lands endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said rectory of Saundby other than those so to be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the rectory and parish of Saundby aforesaid shall continue to belong to the said rectory of Saundby. And that no apportionment shall be made of the sums of £14 8s. 6½d. for first fruits and £1 8s. 10½d. for tenths with which the said rectory of Saundby is now charged. And also that Henry Lord Middleton as patron of the said united benefice consents to such disunion and to the several matters and things above proposed as appears by an instrument in writing under his hand and hereinafter recited. And whereas the consent of the said Henry Lord Middleton as such patron as aforesaid to such disunion and to the several matters and things proposed in the said statement of the said Bishop was in the words following:—

“Consent.”

“I the Right Honourable Henry Lord Middleton the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice of North Wheatley with Saundby in the county of Nottingham and diocese of Lincoln do hereby signify my consent to the disunion of the rectory of Saundby from the vicarage of North Wheatley and to the several matters and things proposed in the annexed statement by the Lord Bishop of Lincoln.

“Given under my hand the 29th day of August in the year of our Lord 1877.

“Middleton.”

And whereas it thereupon appeared to the said Archbishop that the said union might be usefully dissolved and the said Archbishop did thereupon six weeks at least before certifying such enquiry to Her Majesty as in the said Act directed cause a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on the principal outer door of the church in each of the benefices forming part of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion.

And whereas no sufficient cause was shown within the period limited by the said Act, and the said Archbishop did thereupon certify the enquiry and consent of the patron given as hereinbefore mentioned to Her Majesty in Council and did also recommend with the consent of the patron of the said united benefice (such consent being signified in writing as hereinbefore set forth under the hand of such patron) that there should be assigned and attached certain portions of the tithe, rent-

charges or other payments or compositions in lieu of tithes, glebe lands, and other endowments and emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such benefices respectively, which certificate and recommendation of the said Archbishop are in the words and figures following:—

“To the QUEEN’s Most Excellent Majesty in Council.”

“We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

“That the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which is situated the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of North Wheatley and the rectory of Saundby in the county of Nottingham having represented unto us that the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the said rectory of Saundby from the said vicarage of North Wheatley might be made with advantage to the interests of religion we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved.

“That the Right Honourable Henry Lord Middleton is the patron or person entitled to present to the said united benefice if the same were now vacant and he consents to the proposed disunion.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the said representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

“The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the reply thereto and the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before referred to are herewith annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for separating the said rectory of Saundby from the said vicarage of North Wheatley.

“And we recommend with the consent of the before named patron of the said united benefice (such consent being signified in writing under the hand of such patron) that it shall be provided by such Order in Council that all and singular the tithe rent-charges and other payments or compositions in lieu of tithes and all the glebe lands and other endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the said vicarage and parish of North Wheatley shall continue to belong to the said vicarage and the vicar thereof and that by the same Order in Council there shall be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North

Wheatley the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said united benefice of North Wheatley with Saundby and situate at North Wheatley aforesaid and that by the same Order in Council the yearly rent-charges in lieu of tithes belonging to the rectory of Saundby amounting together to three hundred and twenty-six pounds six shillings and one penny and consisting partly of rent-charges arising from lands in the said parish of Saundby and partly of rent-charges arising from lands in the parish of North Wheatley shall be divided and apportioned so that there be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley the rent-charges amounting to one hundred and fifty-five pounds ten shillings and two pence specified in the schedule hereunder written and arising partly from lands in the said parish of North Wheatley and partly from lands in the parish of Saundby and that it shall be provided by the said Order in Council that the

remainder of the said tithe-rent charges belonging to the said rectory of Saundby amounting to one hundred and seventy pounds fifteen shillings and eleven pence and all other (if any) tithe-rent charges glebe lands endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said rectory of Saundby other than those so to be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the rectory and parish of Saundby aforesaid shall continue to belong to the said rectory of Saundby and the rector thereof.

"That no apportionment shall be made of the sums of fourteen pounds eight shillings and sixpence halfpenny for first fruits and one pound eight shillings and ten pence farthing for tenths with which the said rectory of Saundby is now charged.

"The SCHEDULE before referred to.

"All those tithe rent-charges comprised in the second schedule to a certain order of exchange relating to the parishes of Saundby and North Wheatley dated the twenty-second day of March one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven that is to say:—

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and doth hereby order that all and singular the tithe rent-charges and other payments or compositions in lieu of tithes and all the glebe lands and other endowments and emoluments belonging or reputed to belong to the said vicarage of North Wheatley and also all such surplice fees, Easter offerings and other emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within or in respect of the said vicarage and parish of North Wheatley shall continue to belong to the said vicarage and the vicar thereof. And also that there be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of North Wheatley the parsonage or house of residence belonging to the said united benefice of North Wheatley with Saundby and situate at North Wheatley aforesaid. And also that the yearly rent-charges in lieu of tithes belonging to the rectory of Saundby amounting together to sum of three hundred and twenty-six pounds six shillings and one penny and consisting partly of rent-charges arising from lands in the said parish of Saundby and partly of rent-charges arising from lands in the parish of North Wheatley shall be divided and apportioned so that there be

(Improvements in River Thames; Purification of Water; Extension of Jurisdiction of Conservators over Tributaries; Contribution by Conservators, Water Companies, Owners of Property, and others; Increase of Annual Payments by Water Companies; New Capital; Money Powers; Power to enter into Agreements; Power to enter upon Lands; Repeal of Section 9 of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1867;" Transfer of certain Buoys to Trinity House; Amendment of Acts; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the session of 1878 for leave to bring in a Bill and to pass an Act to effect the objects and purposes following, or some of them, that is to say:—

1. To vest in the Conservators of the River Thames (hereinafter referred to as "the Conservators") larger and more effectual powers for preventing the pollution of the waters of the River Thames, and of the several tributary rivers and streams connected therewith, and for purifying such waters respectively.

To authorize and require the Conservators and the several Water Companies following, viz.:—The Governor and Company of the Chelsea Waterworks, the Company of Proprietors of the Lambeth Waterworks, the Grand Junction Waterworks Company, the Southwark and Vauxhall Water Company, the East London Waterworks Company, the Company of Proprietors of the West Middlesex Waterworks, and all other Companies, bodies, and persons taking water from the River Thames for sale, to enter into contracts and agreements for the construction of such works and conveniences as shall be found necessary for purifying and delivering a full and ample supply of water to the inhabitants of the several districts supplied by such Companies respectively, and for sanitary and other purposes, and to enable the Conservators, either alone or conjointly with the before-mentioned Companies, or either of them, to do such works, matters, and things as may be necessary for the before-mentioned purposes, and which shall be sanctioned by Parliament.

4. To empower the Conservators to apply, and, if need be, to borrow upon the credit of any moneys coming to their hands in connection with that portion of the River Thames lying between Staines and Yantlet Creek to the objects and purposes of the intended Act, and generally for the improvement of that portion of the River Thames above Staines, and of the several rivers, streams, and other tributaries discharging their waters into such river, and to provide for the repayment of moneys.

5. To authorize and require the before-mentioned Water Companies respectively to subscribe towards the requisite funds for carrying into effect all or any of the works or improvements to be carried out under the powers of the proposed Act, and to increase the amount of the rents or sums annually payable by the said Companies respectively to the Conservators, and to authorize such Companies respectively to apply their corporate or other funds for the purpose of such subscription and payments, and, if need be, to create new capital, with or without preference in payment of dividends or other advantages attached thereto, and to borrow money upon the credit of their respective undertakings.

6. To extend to the objects and purposes of the proposed Act section 62 of the Thames Navigation Act, 1866, and to amend and enlarge the powers of that section.

7. To alter and increase the rates and charges levied by the Conservators in respect of pleasure-boats and other traffic passing through the locks upon the said river, and to authorize the levying of other rates and charges for the general purposes of the Conservators, and to create exemptions from the payment of rates, duties, and charges.

8. To define the rights, duties, and obligations of the Conservators in connection with towing-paths upon the banks of the said river.

9. To empower the Conservators to confer upon any of their qualified officers such harbour masters' and other powers as may be thought expedient.

10. To empower the Conservators to use, sell, or otherwise dispose of, any materials which they may remove from the bed, shore, or banks of the River Thames, and to make better provision for the recovery of the expenses of and incident to the raising of vessels sunk in the River Thames.

11. To transfer to and vest in the Master, Wardens, and Assistants of the Corporation of Trinity House, Deptford Strond, the several buoys marking shoals in the river, and which are now vested in the Conservators, and to empower the said Corporation of the Trinity House to take over and maintain such buoys.
