### BLACKBURN FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. A representation has been duly made to me by the Town Council of Blackburn, as owners, that a Fair has been annually held in the said borough commencing on the 17th October, and continuing for eight days inclusive, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished.

2. On the 18th day of April, 1878, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.

## THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

## KING'S LYNN (CHEESE) FAIR.
