Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the name be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a

Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. WHEREAS, by the Reserve Force Act, 1867, as amended by the Army Enlistment Act, 1870, it is amongst other things enacted that, in case of imminent national danger, or of great emergency, the occasion being first communicated to Parliament, if Parliament be then sitting, or declared by Proclamation, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Proclamation to direct that the Reserve Force or such part thereof as Her Majesty may think fit may be called out on permanent service, and that upon the issuing of any such Proclamation the men in Class I of the Reserve Force or those of them to whom such Proclamation applies shall become subject to general service with Her Majesty's Army. And the said force, or such part thereof as may be so called out shall serve in pursuance of such Proclamation until it be signified to them by Her Majesty's command that their services are no longer required; but so, nevertheless, that the services of men so called out shall not be required under such Proclamation beyond six months after peace has been next proclaimed:

And whereas the present state of public affairs in the East, and the necessity in connection therewith of taking steps for the maintenance of Peace and for the protection of the interests of the Empire, have, in Our opinion, constituted a case of great emergency within the meaning of the said Acts, and We have communicated the same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, We do, in pursuance of the said Acts, hereby direct, that on the 3rd day of April, 1878, Class I of the Reserve Force shall be called out on permanent service, and that the men thereof shall, on or before the nineteenth day of April, 1878, proceed to, and attend at, the places which may be respectively appointed by Our Secretary of State, to serve as part of our Army until their services are no longer required.

And We do hereby direct the Right Honourable Frederick Arthur Stanley, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas the present state of public affairs in the East, and the necessity in connection therewith of taking steps for the maintenance of Peace and for the protection of the interests of the Empire, have, in Our opinion, constituted a case of great emergency within the meaning of the said Acts, and We have communicated the same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Acts, We do hereby order that on the third day of April, 1878, the men enlisted or serving under the above-mentioned Acts shall enter upon Army Service; and for that purpose shall, on or before the nineteenth day of April, 1878, proceed to, and attend at, the places which may be respectively appointed by Our Secretary of State, and shall serve as part of Our Army until their services are no longer required.

And We do hereby direct the Right Honourable Frederick Arthur Stanley, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in a session of Parliament holden in the 7th and 8th years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to amend the Law respecting the office of County Coroner" it is (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the Justices of any county that such county shall be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act or that alteration shall be made of any division theretofore made under that Act it shall be lawful for the said Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled to resolve that a Petition shall be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division be made and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such Petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such county as thereafter provided and further that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such county and of the time when the Petition shall be taken by the said Justices into consideration and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such Petition having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district the number of the inhabitants the nature of their employments and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act. And that such Petition with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the Petition is founded shall be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such Petition shall have been agreed to. And further that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty if she shall think fit with the advice of Her Privy Council after taking into consideration any such Petition and also any Petition which may be presented to Her by any Coroner of the same county concerning such proposed division or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such county to order that such county shall be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of

that Act as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid shall seem expedient and to give a name to each of such districts and to determine at what place within each district the Court for the election of Coroner for said district shall be holden as thereafter provided.

And whereas by a Petition of the Justices of the Peace of the county of Suffolk in Quarter Sessions assembled it has been represented to Her Majesty that from a time anterior to 1750 the freeholders of the county of Suffolk had elected by virtue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, two Coroners who had exercised their authority throughout the said county, subject to the jurisdictions and franchises of the several coroners of the liberties of Saint Etheldred of Bury Saint Edmunds and the Duke of Norfolk; and also of the several boroughs of Ipswich of Bury Saint Edmunds, of Orford of Aldborough and of Dunwich.

That the then present elected Coroners for the county, subject as aforesaid were Mr. Charles Walter Chaston and Mr. Arthur Frederick Villiamy and that they divided their joint jurisdiction by private arrangement between themselves.

That for the reasons thereafter set forth it seemed expedient to the Justices that the said county subject to the aforesaid jurisdictions and franchises, should be divided into two districts under the provisions of the said Act of 7th and 8th of Her Majesty's reign and thereupon the said Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled on the eighteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven resolved that a Petition should be presented to Her Majesty in Council praying that the said county might be divided into two districts that the further consideration of such Petition should be adjourned until the next Quarter Sessions and that notice thereof should be given to the said County Coroners.

That such notice was duly given to the said Coroners by the Clerk of the Peace.

That at the next Quarter Sessions held on the third day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight the Justices aforesaid did take into consideration the said Petition and the intent of the before-recited Act and such other circumstances as appeared to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act and having likewise conferred with the before-named elected Coroners resolved that a Petition be presented to Her Majesty praying that the county might be divided into two districts, subject nevertheless to the aforesaid jurisdictions and franchises.

And whereas the said Petition with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the said Petition is founded has been duly certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two of the Justices present when such Petition was agreed to and by the said Petition the said Justices did humbly pray that Her Majesty would be pleased by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council to order that the said county of Suffolk should be divided into two Coroners' districts subject to the liberties and franchises thereinbefore recited.

And whereas no Petition has been presented to Her Majesty by either Coroner of the said county concerning the said proposed division.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council having taken the said Petition into consideration is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to grant the prayer thereof and to declare, order and determine.

That the said county of Suffolk shall be divided into two Coroners' districts subject to the jurisdiction and franchises of the several Coroners of the liberties of Saint Etheldred of Bury Saint Edmunds and of the Duke of Norfolk and also of the several boroughs of Ipswich of Bury Saint Edmunds of Orford of Aldborough and of Dunwich.

That one district may comprise and consist of the parishes, hamlets and places within the several hundreds of Hoxne, Wangford Mutford and Lothingland Hartismere and the several parishes of Benacre Brampton Southcove Covehithe Frostenden Henstead Rumburgh and Wrentham in the hundred of Blything and be designated and called the Lowestoft District. And that the other district may comprise and consist of the parishes hamlets and places within the several hundreds of Samford Bosmere and Claydon, Stow and the remaining parishes in the aforesaid Blything hundred and be designated and called the Stowmarket District.

That the Court for the election of Coroners for the Lowestoft District be holden at Lowestoft and for the Stowmarket District at Stowmarket.

And lastly that when any outlying part of any of the aforesaid parishes or of any parish is locally situated within any other district than the main part of such parish such outlying part shall be deemed to be part of such other district.

And further to declare, order and direct that this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Police Courts in the Metropolis," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to alter the number of the Police Courts, and to order such changes to be made of the places in which they should be holden within the Metropolitan Police District as should be found expedient, and every such court should thenceforth be holden in the place in or to which it should be so ordered to be established or removed;

And whereas also by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for better defining the powers of Justices within the Metropolitan Police District," it was, amongst other things enacted "that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to constitute within the Metropolitan Police District so many Police Court Divisions as to Her Majesty should seem fit, and to define the extent thereof, and from time to time to alter the number and extent of such Police Court Divisions, and to assign a Division to each of the Police Courts already established, and to establish a Police Court for each of the other Divisions."

CLERKENWELL POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty, therefore, is pleased, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police Dis-

trict) that is to say, from the boundary of the city of London in Type-street in a line running northward along the boundary of the Worship-street Police Court to Stamford Hill, thence westward along St. Ann's-road (lately called Hanger-lane) to the point of its intersection with the Green Lanes, thence in a straight line to the boundary-stone of the Metropolitan Board of Works District in Dickinson's-lane, thence along Dickinson's-lane and footpath to Hornsey-lane, thence along the same to Dartmouth Park-hill (lately called Maiden-lane) thence along Dartmouth Park-hill and Brecknock-road to Camden-road, thence along the centre of Camden-road to the Red Cap Public-house, thence along the centre of High-street in Camden Town and of Seymour-street to the Euston-road, thence along the boundary of the District assigned to the Bow-street Police Court to the boundary of the City of London on Holborn-hill, and thence along the said City Boundary to Bunhill-row, which space is marked by a green surrounding line on a map to be deposited with a copy of this Order at the Home Office, and signed by the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, shall from and after the 31st day of March instant constitute a Police Court Division, and be assigned to the Police Court called Clerkenwell Police Court.

MARYLEBONE POLICE COURT.

And Her Majesty is further pleased, with the advice aforesaid, to order that the whole parish of Paddington, and the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District), that is to say, from the south end of Edgware-road, opposite the Marble Arch, in a line running eastward along the boundary of the District assigned to the Marlborough-street Police Court as far as Tottenham-court-road, thence along the centre of Euston-road to the corner of Seymour-street, thence northward along the boundary of the District of the Clerkenwell Police Court to Chester-road in Dartmouth Park Hill, thence along Chester-road to Swain's-lane, thence along Swain's-lane to Highgate-road, thence along Highgate-road to the Tottenham and Hampstead Junction Railway Station in Highgate-road, thence along the south side of the said railway to its junction with the Hampstead Junction Railway at Gospel Oak Station, thence along the south side of the said last-mentioned railway to the Hampstead Heath Station, from thence by Pond-street to St. Stephen's Church Hampstead Green, thence in a straight line to the intersection of Finchley-road with West End-lane and Mill-lane, thence along Mill-lane to its intersection with Edgware-road at Shoot-up Hill, thence to and including Kilburn, and thence to the said parish of Paddington, which space is marked on the aforesaid map by a pink surrounding line, shall from and after the 31st day of March instant constitute a Police Court Division, and be assigned to the Police Court called Marylebone Police Court:—

So much of the Order in Council of the 13th day of December, 1844, as relates to the Clerkenwell Police Court and to the Marylebone Police Court Divisions, and the whole of the Order in Council of the 7th day of January, 1864, relating to the Marylebone Police Court Division, are hereby revoked:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventh day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Philip and Saint James situate at Towlaw in the new parish of Thornley, within the original limits of the parish of Wolsingham, in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Thornley and of the parish or district of Satley, also in the said county of Durham and in the said diocese of Durham; which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parish or district respectively.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Thornley and of the said parish or district of Satley should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James situate at Towlaw as aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham, as such Bishop and also as the patron (in right of his see) of the vicarage of the said parish or district of Satley and with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of the diocese of Chester, as the patron (in right of his see) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Thornley (in testimony whereof they the said Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham, and the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Thornley, and of the said parish or district of Satley which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Philip and Saint James situate at Towlaw as afore-

said and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip and Saint James, Towlaw.’

“We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip and Saint James Towlaw, being:—

“All that portion of the new parish of Thornley within the original limits of the parish of Wolsingham in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham, and also all that contiguous portion of the parish or district of Satley in the same county and diocese which said portions are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point at or near to the junction of the line of the Derwent Extension of the Stockton and Darlington Railway with the line of the Hedleyhope Colliery Railway at which point the boundary dividing the new parish of Stanley in the said county and diocese from the new parish of Thornley aforesaid is joined by the boundary dividing the last-named new parish from the new parish of Crook in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Sunnyside past Towlaw to Wolsingham and extending thence westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of nearly two and a quarter miles thereby passing Towlaw aforesaid to a point at the centre of the bridge which carries the same road over the stream called or known as Houseslip Beck upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Thornley from the parish of Wolsingham aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of about two miles (thereby following in part the course of the said stream) to the point at or near to Greenfield Cottages where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Thornley from the parish or district of Satley aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the last-described boundary thereby following for the most part the course of the West Auckland and Corbridge turnpike-road to the point at or near to the house called or known as High Souk where the said turnpike-road is intersected by the Wolsingham and Newcastle turnpike-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named turnpike-road for a distance of thirty and a half chains to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed ‘T. C. C. 1878 No. 1’ and placed on the eastern side of the same turnpike-road, and extending thence south-eastward and in a direct line to the said boundary-stone and continuing thence still generally south-eastward for a distance of one mile and three quarters or thereabouts in a direction parallel to, and distant exactly thirty chains (measured in a direct line) from, the centre of the West Auckland and Corbridge turnpike-road aforesaid to a point upon the boundary which divides the said parish or district of Satley from the new parish of Thornley aforesaid such point being distant exactly thirty chains to the east of the last-named turnpike-road measured in a direct line from the centre of the same turnpike-road (the said imaginary parallel line passing a little to the north-east of the house called or known as Black Field near to which and at the point where

the said line crosses the road leading from Wolsingham to Cornsay a boundary stone inscribed 'T. C. C. 1878 No. 2' is placed, and passing also a little to the east of High West House near to which and at the point where the said line crosses the road leading from the same house to Hedleyhope Colliery a boundary-stone inscribed 'T. C. "Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, situate in the township of Hawsker cum Stainsacre as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Whitby which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of All Saints, situate in the township of Hawsker cum Stainsacre as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Hawsker.'

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of All Saints, Hawsker, being:—

"All that part of the parish or parochial chapelry of Whitby in the county of York and in the diocese of York wherein the present incumbent of such parish or parochial chapelry now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of that the larger portion of the township of Hawsker cum Stainsacre which is not included within the boundary of the Whitby district for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1858 as the same boundary was originally defined in the Order of the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one which said Order was published in the London Gazette on the first day of August in the same year and as the same boundary was subsequently amended by the Provisional Order of the Local Government Board bearing date the first day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four which said Provisional Order was confirmed by the Act of the 37 and 38 Vic. cap. lxxxix, the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1874 (No. 3)."

And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the modifications hereinafter specified:

The light (fixed) is now dioptric of the fourth order, and will show white between the bearings S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. ; red from S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. to the fairway buoy (S.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E.) ; and white from S.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. to E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.

NOTE.—The seaward white light kept in sight, leads westward of Hutchinson Shoal, and north-eastward of the shoal water extending off North Banks.

When the light changes from red to white, on the south-western edge of the red sector, a vessel will be on the line of Yellow Patch Light and the fairway buoy.

DIRECTIONS.—Vessels approaching Moreton Bay from the northward, and entering by Howe Channel—with fine weather and smooth water—should, after making the fixed white light on Comboyuro Point, be careful not to enter the red

sector of Yellow Patch Light, until Comboyuro Point Light is obscured on a S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. bearing.

On Comboyuro Point Light being obscured, haul gradually to the southward, enter the red sector of Yellow Patch Light, and on opening out Comboyuro Point Light, steer for it keeping on the edge of the white light. When Yellow Patch Light comes nearly in line with Cape Moreton Light, edge to the westward and open out the fixed white light on Cowan Cowan Point, which, bearing S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., leads westward of Venus Bank.
