

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the London Bankruptcy Court.

In the Matter of Alfred Hardin, of No. 39, Mile End-road, in the county of Middlesex, Draper, a Bankrupt. Before Mr. Registrar Hazlitt, acting as Chief Judge.
