

of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Peter Blackburn in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Peter Blackburn as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Blackburn which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Luke situate within the limits of such new parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Blackburn.'

"And with the like consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Luke Blackburn being:—

"All that part of the new parish of Saint Peter Blackburn in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which is bounded on the south-east by the new parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, on the south-west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew Livesey, on the west by the new parish of Saint Mark, Witton, all in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the remaining sides that is to say on the north and on the east partly by the new parish of Saint Paul Blackburn in the same county and diocese and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul Blackburn from the new parish of Saint Peter Blackburn aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries George-street West over the River Blakewater and extending thence first southward then eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said river for a distance

of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of King-street Bridge which connects King-street with the street or road called or known as Whalley Banks and extending thence south-westward and along the middle of the last-named street or road for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Harrison-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same street with Canterbury-street and with Alice-street which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Peter Blackburn from the new parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say;

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the Archdeaconry of Surrey in the diocese of Winchester and to certain rural deaneries being all the rural deaneries within the county of Surrey, which are now within that archdeaconry and within that diocese and relating to certain parishes or other cures within the same archdeaconry which are not at present within any rural deanery and also relating to the Archdeaconry of Winchester in the same diocese, and to a certain rural deanery therein.

"Whereas in pursuance of the lastly hereinbefore mentioned Act a schedule under the hand and seal of the Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester has been prepared and deposited in the registry of the same diocese setting forth the portions or divisions of the diocese of Winchester
