A DESPATCH, of which the following is a copy, has been received by the Secretary of State for War from the Lieutenant-General Commanding the troops in South Africa:—

*King William's Town,
Cape of Good Hope,*

5th May, 1878.

SIR,

HAVING returned to King William's Town, I take the opportunity of sending you a report up to date, of the operations now in progress. As the mail does not leave for a few days, I trust I may be able to add a further report to the one I have now the honour to make.

1. You will have heard by my last despatch, dated 24th April, that the rebels had, during the enforced lull in active operations, collected in the Buffalo Range, and in the bush lying around the Intala Ka' Udoda, and that I had determined to operate in the latter district first. I hardly hoped to conceal this intention from the Kafirs, whose spies are everywhere, even in King William's Town, but it is nevertheless reported from various sources that they believed the Perie Bush (Buffalo Range) was the first point to be attacked.

2. On Monday the 29th April (on which day I took the field myself) the forces detailed for the attack moved, as follows, to posts already occupied:—

From King William's Town to Bailie's Post.

Four companies 2nd Battalion 24th Foot under Colonel Degacher; 2 7-pr. guns under Major Harness, R.A.; 2 7-pr guns under Lieutenant Giles, R.A., worked by bandmen, of 1st Battalion 24th Foot, assisted by a few artillerymen.

Garrison already at this post—Frontier Light Horse under Major Buller, C.B., 60 rifles; 1 company 2nd Battalion 24th Foot; Maclean's Fingoes under Commandant Allan Maclean, 60 Hottentots.

From Middle Drift to Burn's Hill.

Two 7-pr. guns under Captain Smith, R.A.; 2 7-pr. guns under Lieutenant Curling, R.A.; 1 company 90th Light Infantry.

Garrison already at this post—2 companies 90th Light Infantry.

From Keiskama Hock to Yellow Wood Drift.

Lonsdale's Fingoes.

Garrison already there—Streatfield's Fingoes; 1 company 90th Light Infantry.

From Tamacha Post to Dele Neck.

Von Linsingen's Fingoes under Captain Ronald Maclean.

Garrison already there—Siwani's Kafirs under Captain Clarke; Graham's Town Volunteers under Captain Sampson; Von Linsingen's Mounted and Dismounted Volunteers.

Fort White and Makalalekite Neck.

Occupied by Diamond Field Horse under Captain Warren, R.E.

Post near Figland's Farm.

Held by 1 company 90th Light Infantry and Hottentots under Lieutenant White.

Green River (Hall's Hotel).

Somerset Volunteers under Captain Comeley.

3. My instructions for the attack on Tuesday, the 30th April, were as follows:—

"On Tuesday, the 30th April the forces will advance from their respective camps, so as to be ready to attack at daybreak.

"Colonel Wood's force, as per margin*, will advance in two columns; Streatfield's and Lonsdale's Fingoes, supported by 2 companies 90th Light Infantry, will beat the bush towards the Taba Ka' Udoda on the right side of the Zanyorkive Valley. Bowker's Rovers will watch this valley.

"Three companies 90th Light Infantry, with 4 guns and Diamond Field Horse will advance from Burn's Hill and Makalalekite Ridge on to the open ground west of the Taba Ka' Udoda.

"Commandant Von Linsingen's force will move up the Burnside; Bailie's Post-road, and will beat the southern slopes of the Taba Ka' Udoda, in a westerly direction, and work its way eventually on to the open ground on which Colonel Wood's European column will debouch.

"Lieutenant-Colonel Degacher's force, consisting of 5 companies 2nd Battalion 24th, and 4 guns, will move from Bailie's Post to the ground near the Intala Ka' Udoda, where the guns will be placed in position to shell the bush.

"Maclean's Fingoes will move at 2 A.M., from Bailie's Post to the mouth of the Zanyorkive Valley, and will beat the eastern side of the valley bush towards the Intala Ka' Udoda.

"Frontier Light Horse and 1 company 2nd Battalion 24th, under Major Buller, C.B., 60th Rifles, will move one hour before daylight to ridge between Zanyorkive and Congo Valley.

"Captain Sampson's Volunteers will watch the bush on the south side of the Intala Ka' Udoda,

and prevent the rebels breaking out in a south-westerly direction.

"Captain Comeley will watch the bush leading from the Intala Ka' Udoda to the Perie Bush, and endeavour to prevent the rebels crossing from one to the other.

"The Hottentots now at the drift near Ballie's Post will guard the last named post during the absence of the company 2nd Battalion 24th Foot.

4. By 5 A.M. the forces were in motion, and by 6.15 A.M., as it was getting light, Colonel Degacher's force* occupied the heights round the Intala Ka' Udoda. I accompanied this force. None of the enemy were met in this direction.

5. As the mounted scouts of the 88th Regiment (these 12 men formed my personal escort) reported that the enemy were to be seen below in the Zanyorkive Valley, and on the outskirts of the bush above, I ordered 2 guns and 2 companies to a position commanding this ground.

The rebels were already on the move, and it is difficult to account for their subsequent behaviour, unless they were completely surprised. When the artillery opened a well-directed fire, a large number of the enemy moved rapidly in a south-westerly direction towards the point where Colonel Wood's right column was advancing, and another portion descended to the valley towards the position occupied by Lieutenant-Colonel Degacher's force.

It has been stated that they intended to attack us, but that the heavy fire under which the rebels came crossing the valley, changed their determination. This party took the bush below, and dispersing in small parties, were met during the day as our lines closed in upon them, and lost severely.

About 6.45 A.M., heavy firing was heard from Colonel Wood's direction, and from the hurried movements of the Kafirs who had taken that direction, it was evident an engagement was taking place, and one that gave them encouragement, for they advanced and retired more than once towards and into the bush which concealed Colonel Wood's advance from us.

6. Colonel Wood's despatch enclosed (marked A) explains in detail what occurred there. I regret to state that Captain Stevens, 90th Light Infantry, was very severely wounded at the time when commanding and leading the company that formed part of the advanced guard. He was succeeded in the command by his subaltern Lieutenant Saltmarsh, who was shot five minutes afterwards in the act of encouraging his men. As Colonel Wood observes, "these officers acted in the most gallant manner, offering a fine example to all."

7. The path by which this column of Colonel Wood's force had to advance was surrounded by dense bush, which completely screened the Kafirs. It was a most difficult position for the Artillery, who were at first unable to use their guns, but the steadiness of the men under Captain Smith, R.A., has been reported to me to have been all that could be desired. Shortly afterwards they were enabled to unlimber and fire case into the bush at a distance of 30 yards.

8. Major Cherry, 90th Light Infantry, in the meantime took on the company of the 90th Light Infantry (left without officers), and, moving by short rushes, succeeded in gaining the open ground beyond the bush. This was at 7.50 A.M., and I saw them emerge, rapidly followed by the 2 guns, the whole firing into the bush which they had left, thus taking the enemy in flank.

9. Five minutes later Commandant Von Linsingen's force,* appeared on the sky line to the left of Lieutenant-Colonel Degacher's force, crowning the Intala Ka' Udoda and the neck connecting it with the heights occupied by Colonel Wood's force. The subsequent operations of this place are narrated in Commandant Von Linsingen's report attached (marked B).

10. At 8 A.M. Major Buller, C.B., who was posted to my right about 1,500 yards, overlooking the valley, asked permission (by flag signal) to descend with 50 dismounted men of the Frontier Light Horse (of which he is Acting-Commandant) and one company 2nd Battalion 24th Foot. I re-inforced this party by Captain Austen's company of the 2nd Battalion 24th Regiment; Major Black of that regiment accompanied it. They descended to an enclosure at the bottom of the valley, where the rebels had left a large number of cattle, and then worked their way to the high ground on the opposite side, and eventually entered the bush with the other troops.

11. From this time until sunset the Zanyorkive Valley, with the kloofs running from it, were steadily worked through by the various forces. The Fingoes, under Allan Maclean, advancing from the north, searched the eastern side, and were subsequently assisted by three and a-half companies under Colonel Degacher, whilst the opposite side was taken by Commandant Von Linsingen's Colonel Wood, assisted by a portion of the latter force, and the two companies 2nd Battalion 24th Foot and Frontier Light Horse, with Majors Black and Buller, thoroughly searched the Tutu and other kloofs leading from this valley.

12. Very soon a large number of women (350 to 400) belonging to Seyolo's, Pato's and Edmund Sandilli's people, surrendered themselves. Fortunately the women and children generally leave the bush soon after the first shot is fired; their presence otherwise would be most embarrassing, as in the thick bush it is difficult to detect the fact of their being women. On one occasion, however, during this day they facilitated the escape of the men by forming up in front of them, and narrowly escaped being killed.

13. The women stated that Colonel Wood's force had been opposed by Seyolo and 400 men, and that Macaomo and Edmund Sandilli had been in the Tutu-kloof.

14. The Kafirs fought with determination at certain points, but the ground they endeavoured to hold was far too extended for their force, and they were quite over-weighted by the presence of so many Europeans, as the ten companies present in the field worked through the bush in the most creditable manner.

15. The system of flag signalling was found most valuable; it enabled me to know what was happening over a large extent of broken country, and to transmit the necessary orders. Colonel Wood was able to telegraph from the position he had gained with his advance-guard to the remainder of his force that had not entered the bush, "Advance with caution," when it would have been dangerous to have sent a messenger; and I myself was informed of what had happened, and of the names of the officers killed and wounded, &c., a very short time after the occurrence—information that could not have reached me by messenger sooner than in three hours, and not at all had the valley been still occupied by the enemy.

16. By sunset the day's work had been satisfactorily concluded, and the troops returned to their original posts.

17. The loss of the enemy on the 30th April, as found actually killed, was 141 killed. Our loss (excepting Colonel Wood's right column) was slight: it amounted to 1 officer 90th Light Infantry killed, 1 officer 90th Light Infantry wounded very severely, 2 privates 90th Light Infantry killed, 5 of the same corps wounded (two of whom have since died), 2 Fingoes killed, 5 wounded.

18. Early on the 1st of May parties of Kafirs endeavoured to pass across to the Buffalo Range, and no doubt some succeeded. At 4 A.M. heavy firing from the direction of Maclean's Fingoes, near Bailie's Post, being heard, I despatched a company of 2nd Battalion 24th Foot to their assistance, when it was found that one of these parties had actually stumbled upon this camp in the dark, and 1 Kafir had been shot. At daylight the bush between that spot and the Intala Ka' Udoda was searched by Maclean's Fingoes, assisted by the Frontier Light Horse, and the Somerset Volunteers, 2 guns and 2 companies 2nd Battalion 24th Foot. Later in the day, Von Linsingen's force from Dele Neck searched the bush which had not already been entered by the above mentioned troops: 11 Kafirs were killed, 2 prisoners taken, and 100 women and children surrendered.

19. On the 2nd May I myself visited all the posts round the Intala district. Colonel Degacher, with 2 companies 2nd Battalion 24th Foot and 2 guns, and Commandant Von Linsingen, with his force, proceeded to the Zanyorkive Valley, to make further search after rebels. In the afternoon, after the return of Colonel Degacher's force to camp, a party of rebels, supposed to number 50, amongst whom it is said were Seyolo and five other chiefs, were discovered in a strong position, under the precipice shown in map as "Seyolo's Krantz." The position was covered by dense bush, and by large detached boulders of rock, from behind which the enemy fired on any one approaching it; one of Siwani's Kafirs, belonging to Von Linsingen's force, was killed in endeavouring to do so. Colonel Degacher's force returned on receiving this intelligence, but it was found that the guns could not be used without withdrawing the cordon of men necessary to prevent the rebels' escape.

Commandant Von Linsingen passed the night in the valley with his men. I should add that every endeavour was made to induce this party of rebels to surrender, but without effect.

At 8 A.M. 3rd May, Commandant Von Linsingen commenced an attack; at noon he reported that he had taken the position: 21 Kafirs were killed, and two prisoners taken. On examining the ground an almost impracticable path underneath the precipice was found, by which it is believed Seyolo and a few of the rebels escaped during the night.

Our loss on this day and the previous one was 4 natives killed and 3 wounded, of this number 2 of Siwani's Kafirs were killed and 2 wounded. It will be observed by Commandant Von Linsingen's report, that these loyal Kafirs behaved extremely well, and showed an example of bravery to the other natives, the gallant conduct of Captain Clarke, their leader, and of "Jam," a relative of Siwani, is especially brought to notice.

20. On receiving this report from Von Linsingen, I ordered my Head-Quarters to move to King William's Town, visiting the Peri chain of posts, south of the Buffalo Range, on my way.

Movements of troops are now taking place for a continuance of operations in another quarter, the details of which will form a separate report.

21. It having been reported to me on the 3rd instant that the rebels on the Buffalo Range were collecting above Keiskama Hock, I arranged that Colonel Wood should attack them the following morning, the enemy however anticipated this by descending in force into the Gwili-gwili Valley before daybreak on the 3rd.

Captain Develing in command of the Alice Fingoe Levy, numbering only 150 men, and Captain Pohl, who had been watching for some days this part of the country, at once attacked them, and after a short engagement drove them back up the hill into the Buffalo Poort Bush; 22 of the rebels were counted dead on the field, 4 of Captain Develing's men were wounded, 1 Fingoe woman and 1 man, resident in the valley, were killed, and 3 wounded. Captain Develing re-took all but 10 head of the 100 cattle and 300 sheep which had been captured by the rebels.

No doubt this raid was made with the object of obtaining supplies, as all my information shows that the rebels in the Buffalo Range are suffering from hunger.

Great credit is due to Captain Develing for his prompt action in this affair: although quite unsupported he attacked without hesitation a largely superior force, and his men must have behaved equally well, as I know the ground where the fight took place to be very difficult.

22. Commandant Lonsdale reports that on arriving with reinforcements he found the rebels in full retreat and disappearing over the heights.

23. Commandant Scherbrucker, whose camp is under Mount Kemp, on hearing the firing promptly moved out, but arrived too late to be able to effect anything material.

He reports seeing a larger number of the enemy about the Buffalo Range plateau, which we cleared this day month, than he has observed before. No doubt the fugitives from the Intala Ka' Udoda have re-inforced them, but as on the 30th ult. the whole of the cattle were captured, I am of opinion that they are not in any way strengthened by this addition to their numbers, for if the reports are true that reach me, they have carried to them the news of a signal defeat, and they will certainly find it difficult to obtain a sufficiency of food.

24. I would beg to call your attention to an affair referred to in Colonel Wood's report, which took place on the 23rd ult., in which Commandant Streetfield successfully repulsed an attack made on him by the rebels in the Rabula Valley, and inflicted on them considerable loss.

Transkei.—Colonel Glyn, 1st Battalion 24th Regiment, with a considerable force is operating on the Bashee, and Major Elliott with Native Levies is moving on the left bank.

I have not received any particulars up to date of their proceedings.

Transvaal and Natal.—There is nothing to report from this portion of the command.

Tamboekieland and St. John's.—I regret that I am still unable to furnish a report of the late operations of Major Elliott in the Gatberg country, but none has reached me, his dispatches which were forwarded to me by the Hon. Secretary for Native Affairs have apparently miscarried.

There is nothing new from Kakstadt.

From Colonel Evelyn Wood, Commanding Field Force, to the Deputy Adjutant-General.

SIR, *Burn's Hill, 11 P.M., 30th April, 1878.*

I HAVE the honour to inform you that the troops operating on the western side of the Seuyoea Valley marched before daylight under the following arrangements:—Two companies 90th Light Infantry, about 160 men; Lonsdale's Fingoes, 750; Streatfield, 350 men; the whole under Major Hackett. The 90th Light Infantry advanced from the Lower Rabula towards the Tutu Bush, the right of the line reaching nearly to Figland's Farm, while the left touched the water line of the Seuyoea Valley.

Bowker's Rovers watched Hobb's Drift and the Lower Rabula.

2. The Burn's Hill detachment, consisting of 4 guns, R.A., 25 mounted men, and 3 companies 90th Light Infantry, in all about 250 men, 130 Stockenstrom Hottentot Levy, and 46 Alice Police under Mr. Chalmers, moved up the Makabalekile Ridge, followed by 50 men of the Diamond Field Horse under Colonel Warren, R.E., the remainder of whose men watched Debe Flats. Lieutenant Cameron, R.E., assisted me as an orderly officer.

3. As we ascended the ridge, Kafirs in considerable numbers, estimated from 300 to 500 men, were seen running from the eastward to reinforce the rebels already in ambush on either side of the path. These soon opened fire on our advanced guard, consisting of Captain Stevens' company 90th Light Infantry, and Captain Smith's 2 guns (horsed), under my immediate direction.

4. The rebels behaved with great spirit; two or three men were shot down at close quarters in the path, while large bodies stood their ground inside some thick bush close to our advance.

5. Captain Stevens being severely wounded whilst at the head of his company, I directed his subaltern, Lieutenant Saltmarsh, to take his place, but in less than five minutes he was shot dead. Both these officers acted in the most gallant and determined manner, offering a fine example to all. I then desired Major Cherry, who had previously commanded the main body, to head the front company, which he did, moving rapidly forward by short rushes, and being materially assisted by Captain Smith's guns, which fired case into rebels in the bush distant about 30 yards only.

6. After gaining the open ground, we halted to enable the ambulances, Scotch carts, and bullock guns, which I ordered by flag signal to advance, to join us. We then moved forward, and after effecting a junction with Commandant Von Linsingen and Major Buller, the troops under the latter lined the bush path leading into the Seuyoea, while Von Linsingen's men and the 90th Light Infantry moved down the Seuyoea and Tutu ravines to meet the Lower Rabula column which joined us about 4 P.M.

7. The force ascending the Makabalekile Ridge took about 70 head of cattle and some few horses. Between 350 and 400 women who came out of the bush, and who belonged generally to Seyolo's, E. Sandilli's and Pato's tribes, stated that Seyolo himself with 400 men defended the Makabalekile Ridge.

E. Sandilli and Macomo were in the Tutu Bush.

8. It is impossible to state exactly how many Kafirs were killed on the Makabalekile Ridge. The rebels were in force, and were seen carrying off their dead and wounded. Nine were counted north and seven south of the path, but they were those only in the immediate vicinity of the path. The Lower Rabula force under Major

Hackett, counted 35 dead Kafirs, Von Linsingen's column, 16.

9. I append a list of casualties in the Burn's Hill detachment, which, as it was out of one company, is to my regret, severe.

The only other casualties west of the Seuyoea were two of Lonsdale's Fingoes wounded near Figland's Farm.

The wounded men received every attention possible from Surgeon-Major Alcock.

The Lieut.-General himself must have noticed the great benefit of signalling which is eminently adapted for this country intersected by deep ravines.

From Commandant Von Linsingen to Deputy-Adjutant-General.

Debe Neck, 1st May, 1878.

1. AS ordered, the corps under my orders took up its position to attack the rebels, suspected to be at and around the Intaba Indoda, at sunrise yesterday as follows:—

Right wing, under Captain Rautenbach, half Rautenbach's and half Berlin Horse mounted, 10 men of Rautenbach's and other half of Berlin Horse dismounted, together with Maclean's and Kirsten's Fingoes, to attack the south-east of the Taba Indoda, leaving their extreme right—the mounted men—on the road leading from here to Baillie's Post.

Centre, under my direct command, consisting of No. 2 company, Buffalo Volunteer Rifles, under Lieutenant Selzer, of the Punzana Fingoes under Captain Clarke, Ludwig's Fingoes, 20 dismounted Humansdorp men, and 300 Siwani's Kafirs, to attack the south-west of the Taba Indoda. The Kafirs of Siwani, led by Captain Clarke and Lieut. Selzer, were supported by the whole of No. 2 company, Buffalo Volunteer Rifles, and behaved extremely well, knew no "single file" business, and were difficult to be held in when on the track of the enemy. They killed seven rebels; one of these was hit by an assegai, thrown from a distance of nearly fifty yards. They are very indifferently armed, having guns of a very inferior description, and one-half only armed with assegais.

Left wing, under Captain Warren, consisting of Warren's Horse, Bartholomew's Fingoes, Keis Kama Fingoes, to advance from the Makabalekile Ridge towards the Taba Indoda, scouring the slopes towards the south.

2. A little after sunrise the whole forces were ordered to advance; only old traces of Kafir encampments were found; on gaining the top of the ridges, we noticed enemy's cattle and a few of the enemy to the north. As soon as all the different forces had crowned the respective ridges, the whole of the forces were directed to scour the west of the Zanyorkive Valley, with the exception of the left wing under Captain Warren and two companies of Siwani's Kafirs, who were placed at the disposal of Colonel Wood. In the Zanyorkive Valley only old camping grounds were found; we advanced until we fell in with Lonsdale's and Streatfield's Fingoes, supported by a company of the 90th, and then made a three-quarter wheel to the left, and assisted in scouring the valley where most of the rebels were expected. In all 17 rebels were killed by my corps, most of them in the deep kloof leading to the Zanyorkive. Captain Warren, hearing heavy firing on his extreme left, hurried up in that direction, and was in time to co-operate

against the rebels, who had been attacking the Artillery, and were retreating step by step.

I am happy to report that I am well satisfied with the behaviour of every officer and man of my force engaged, and beg at the same time to thank His Excellency for giving me the valuable assistance of his aide-de-camp Lieutenant Molyneux.

From Colonel Evelyn Wood, Commanding District, to the Deputy Adjutant-General.

Sir, *Alice, 24th April, 1878.*

IN confirmation of my telegram of this date, I have the honor to report that on Commandant Streatfield moving into the Rabula Valley yesterday afternoon, he was attacked by rebel Kafirs, whose numbers he estimates at from 600 to 800. He repulsed and followed them up for some distance, and on his again withdrawing they followed his men across the Rabula River, near which several rebels were killed with assegais. He again advanced, and drove them up the Seyoea Valley, and then returned and encamped unmolested. Two of the 1st Fingoe Levy were wounded. Thirty-four rebel bodies were counted. Major Cherry sent half a company, 90th Light Infantry, to support the Fingoes, but the rebels retired before it reached the place. I have now sent a company to encamp near the Fingoes.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of London as a part thereof and landing-place within and at which animals brought from a port or place in France may be landed for quarantine, as follows :

All that space, part of the premises known as Brown's Wharf, situate at Blackwall, in the parish of Poplar, in the county of Middlesex, and in the occupation of the General Steam Navigation Company, lying between the River Thames and the street or roadway called Cold Harbour, together with the jetty springing from the southern end of the eastern side of such space, and a moveable cattle brow connecting the same with a floating hulk moored in the River Thames a distance of 95 feet from the land face of the said premises, together with a portion of such hulk, which said hulk, cattle brow, jetty, and premises are more particularly delineated and coloured pink on a plan deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the City of London, the dimensions being as follows :

Starting from a line at the north-east end of the said space they extend towards the south along the face of the river 79 feet, then along the northern side of the said jetty and cattle brow due east 95 feet, then in a northerly direction on the west side of the said hulk 40 feet, then due east along a bulwark across the hulk 26 feet, then in a southerly direction on the east side of the said hulk 70 feet, then round the stern of the said hulk to the southern side of the said cattle-brow a distance of 32 feet, then due west along the south side of the cattle-brow and jetty 95 feet, then towards the south along the face of the river 16 feet, then due west along the paling separating the said space from other premises of the said Company 52 feet, then in a northerly direction along the said street or roadway called Cold Harbour 114 feet, then due east along a wall and paling dividing the said space from other parts of

the said premises not included in this Order 51 feet, which defined part and landing-place is in this Order referred to as the landing-place.

And do hereby prescribe as follows :

1. Regulation Six of the Fourth Schedule to The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, shall not apply to such animals as aforesaid landed within the landing-place, and such animals shall be placed in pens, sheds, or other receptacles within the landing-place properly prepared for their reception by the consignees or other persons, and approved for that purpose by the Privy Council, and shall be kept therein at the sole expense of the owner or consignee, subject to the supervision and control of an Inspector of the Privy Council, and in accordance with any regulations made by the Privy Council, for such period, not exceeding fourteen days, as the Privy Council from time to time prescribe, and such animals so landed and kept may be moved to any place out of the limits of the landing-place with a certificate of an Inspector of the Privy Council certifying that they are free from contagious or infectious disease ; but not otherwise.

2. During the continuance of this Order the landing-place shall be used for the landing and keeping in quarantine under this Order of animals brought from a port or place in France, and for no other purpose.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day ; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the said Act.
