observation of three or five days, according as the voyage has been of more or less than fourteen days.

ART. 2. This quarantine will be increased to five or seven days, if the vessels are declared by

the Health Officer to be unhealthy.

ART. 3. Vessels which during the voyage or on arrival have had cases of sick or dead of yellow fever on board, will be subjected to ten days'

rigorous quarantine.

ART. 4. Both for the quarantine of observation and for the rigorous quarantine, the measures for disinfection and for landing of goods prescribed by the quarantine regulations approved by the Government Decree of 29th April, 1867, remain obligatory.

ART. 5. Vessels in the above conditions can be admitted to pratique, if they have already undergone a quarantine corresponding to the present Decree, and have been already received into pratique in some Mediterranean port.
