THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

PRESTON (LANCASHIRE) HORSE FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Town Council of Preston, Lancashire, as owners, that a Horse Fair has been annually held in that borough, commencing on Monday in the first full week in the month of January, and continuing during the remainder of such week, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be held on a less number of days, and that instead of being held as aforesaid, such Fair should in future be held on the Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday only, in the first full week in the month of January, in each year.

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into

consideration, has been duly given to the Justices acting in and for the said borough of Preston, Lancashire, within whose Petty Sessional Jurisdiction the said Fair is held, and otherwise published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the time for the holding of the said Fair should be shortened as proposed:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the days shall be shortened for the holding of the Horse Fair which has been annually held in the borough of Preston, Lancashire, and that the said Horse Fair which has been hitherto held commencing on Monday, in the first full week in the month of January, and continuing during the remainder of such week, shall in future be held on a less number of days, and shall be held on the Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday only, in the first full week in the month of January, in each year.

The following information has been received, relative to the depth of water on Oton Bank, Port Ilo Ilo (Yloilo):—

The bank is composed of shifting sand, and vessels should not attempt to cross it. The northern channel across Oton Bank, formerly carrying a depth of from 3½ to 4 fathoms, has shoaled considerably, and the pilots have recently declined to take vessels drawing less than 13 feet through it. The south channel (between Oton Bank and Guimeras) is now exclusively used by the pilots.
