of Southery aforesaid) to the first-described point where such county boundary crosses the drain or watercourse called or known as Willow Rows Drain as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the several cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ely.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirtyfour; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth year of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary Magdalene situate in Back Wood-street, in the new parish of Saint Jude, Manningbam, within the original limits of the parish of Saint Peter, Bradford, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mary Magdalene, situate in Back Wood-street as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical

our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Mary Magdalene situate in Back Wood-street as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham.

"And with the like consent of the said Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, (testified as aforesaid, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seeem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham being:

"All that part of the new parish of Saint Jude Manningham within the original limits of the parish of Saint Peter Bradford in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon which is bounded on the north-west by the new parish of Saint Mark, Manningham on the south-west by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Bradford both within the original limits of the parish of Saint Peter Bradford aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south-east and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Bradford from the new parish of Saint Jude Manningham aforesaid at the point where White Abbey-road is joined by Abbey-street and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lumb-lane and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same lane with Montgomery-street which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Jude Manningham from the new parish of Saint Mark Manningham aforesaid."
