And notice is hereby further given, that Her Majesty has been pleased, by Her Order in Council of this day's date, to order that the said Petition be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Tuesday, the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1875.
2. Notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order of 1875, or any other Order of Council, animals brought from a port or place in Her Majesty's possessions in North America, or from the United States of America, may be landed at the Basin or Dock and premises called or known as the Roath Basin of the Bute Docks, the property of the Marquis of Bute, situate at Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan.
3. The Roath Basin or Dock and premises shall not be deemed to be a defined part of a port within the meaning of The Animals Order of 1875, and the regulations contained in Chapter 16 (Animals in Defined Parts of Ports) of that Order shall not apply to animals landed under the provisions of this Order.
4. All the regulations contained in Chapter 14 (Foreign Animals generally) and Chapter 17 (Animals landed out of Defined Parts of Ports) of The Animals Order of 1875 shall apply, so far as the same are applicable, to animals landed under the provisions of this Order.

The Queen taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of William Sydney, Earl of Leitrim, without issue, on the 2nd day of April last, the title and dignity of Earl of Leitrim devolved upon his nephew, Robert Bermingham, now Earl of Leitrim, only son of the late Francis Nathaniel Clements, Clerk, commonly called the Honourable and Reverend Francis Nathaniel Clements, as the only surviving grandson and heir male of Nathaniel, second Earl of Leitrim, and that, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the sisters of the said Robert Bermingham, Earl of Leitrim, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them had their said father survived and succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Leitrim, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Anne, the wife of Henry Augustus Murray, Esq., Caroline, the wife of John Madden, of Hilton Park, in the county of Monaghan, Esq., Elizabeth Emily, the wife of Henry Andrew Harper, Esq., Louisa Frances, the wife of the Venerable George Hans Hamilton, Archdeacon of Lindisfarne, Selina Charlotte Clements and Mary Florence Edith Clements, Spinsters, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, and precedence as if their late father, the said Francis Nathaniel Clements, had survived his elder brother, William Sydney, late Earl of Leitrim, and had thereby succeeded to the dignity of Earl of Leitrim :

And to command that the said Royal order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
