PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th of June, 1878, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council, dated the 9th day of September 1865 and 4th day of February 1875, which Orders in Council were embodied in the Revised Pension Regulations for Your Majesty's Navy and Marines established by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 12th day of February 1876, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to appoint Pensions of five pence a day at the age of 55 and an additional four pence a day at the age of 65 to be given, out of the Funds of Greenwich Hospital, at our discretion, and under certain conditions, to Seamen and Marines who are in receipt of Naval Pensions for Life, but without restriction as to the number of such Pensions to be in force at any one time, or as to the amount of combined Pensions to be enjoyed together. And whereas, in consequence of the rapid increase which is taking place in the annual charge for these Pensions, and which increase will, it is estimated, continue to attain greater proportions, we are of opinion that, having regard to the Funds of Greenwich Hospital available for these Pensions, it is absolutely necessary to diminish the annual charge on account thereof.

"We do, therefore, beg leave to submit that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Order in Council to direct that, for the future, the number of such Pensions in force at any one time shall not exceed 7,500; and that the following regulations be established with a view to limiting combined Pensions from Public and Greenwich Hospital Funds to two shillings and sixpence a day.

"I. The Greenwich Hospital Age Pension to be awarded at the ages of 55 and 65 as at present, provided it does not, together with any other Pension or Pensions which a man may have from Public Funds, cause the combined Pensions to exceed two shillings and sixpence a day.

"II. If the grant of the full amount of the Greenwich Hospital Age Pensions should cause such excess, only so much shall be awarded as will

make the combined Pensions up to two shillings and sixpence a day.

"III. In the event of a Pensioner having already two shillings and sixpence a day, Pension, or Pensions, from Public Funds, the Greenwich Age Pension, or any part of it, shall not be awarded in addition thereto.

"IV. In the event of a Pensioner, who has been granted a Greenwich Hospital Age Pension under these regulations, obtaining an increase of Pension, or an additional Pension, from other Public sources, which would cause his combined Pensions to exceed two shillings and sixpence a day, his Greenwich Hospital Age Pension shall be reduced, or altogether cease, in order to preserve the limit of two shillings and sixpence a day.

"V. Vacancies to be filled up, by selection, at our discretion, regard being had to the circumstances of each man's case.

"VI. These regulations to take effect from the 1st day of January last, but not to affect any Pensioner who at the date of Your Majesty's Order in Council approving the same, shall be in receipt of a Greenwich Hospital Age Pension; or any Pensioner who, being already in receipt of five pence a day, will be eligible for the additional four pence a day on attaining the age of 65: nor to affect any Pensioner who has joined the Seaman Pensioner Reserve Force prior to the issue of these Regulations, and who is thereby entitled, under certain conditions, to the Greenwich Hospital Age Pension of five pence a day at the age of 50.

"And whereas we are further of opinion that men who have been discharged from Your Majesty's Corps of Royal Marines with claims to Deferred Pensions on attaining the age of 50, should not be eligible for Greenwich Hospital Age Pensions in addition thereto, as they cannot be considered as entitled to Naval Pensions for life within the meaning of Your Majesty's previous Orders in Council before quoted.

"We beg leave to submit that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Order in Council, to declare them to be ineligible accordingly."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-third day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary situate at Liscard in the parish of Wallasey in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mary situate at Liscard as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Wallasey which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Mary situate at Liscard as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Liscard.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The **SCHEDULE** to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Liscard, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Wallasey in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the north-east by the eastern boundary of the said parish of Wallasey in the middle of the River Mersey on the north-west by the new parish of Saint James New Brighton within the original limits of the parish of Wallasey aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the west and on the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James New Brighton from the parish of Wallasey aforesaid at a point in the middle of Marsden-lane opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'N. B. St. J. D. C. 1861 No. 1' and placed on the eastern side of such lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the same lane for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the township of Wallasey in the said parish of Wallasey from the township of Liscard in the same parish and extending thence first generally southward and then south-eastward along the said township boundary for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts to the point on the south-eastern side of Mill-lane where the same township boundary joins the boundary dividing the said township of Liscard from the township of Poolton-cum-Seacombe in the parish of Wallasey aforesaid and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from Poolton into Liscard-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of ten and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Liscard-road aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Martin's-lane and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rice-lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of six and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Trafalgar-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-four and a half chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end on the shore of the River Mersey aforesaid and continuing thence still north-eastward and in a direct line to the eastern boundary of the said parish of Wallasey in the middle of the River Mersey as aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forth-

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards and burial-ground hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards and burial-ground be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards and burial-ground be postponed as follows, viz.:—

In the churchyard of Saint John, Sheffield, to the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, on condition that the restrictions contained in that part of the Order in Council of the fourth of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, relating to that churchyard be observed.

In the churchyard of Stony Middleton, in the parish of Hathersage, to the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

In the churchyard of Winlaton to the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

In the churchyard of Writtle, Essex, to the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

In the churchyard of Whitworth, Rochdale, and in the burial-ground of Hale Fold Independent Chapel, Whitworth, to the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

In the churchyard of Shipdham, Norfolk, to the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

In the churchyard of Madron, in the county of Cornwall, to the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications, viz.:—

MARKET HARBOUROUGH.—Forthwith wholly in the Baptist Chapelyard, Market Harborough, except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

CLEETHORPES.—Forthwith wholly in Saint Peter's Church, Cleethorpes; and in the churchyard, except in now existing vaults and walled graves which are free from water, every coffin buried in which shall be separately entombed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

NORTH SOMERCOTES.—Forthwith wholly in North Somercotes Church, in the county of Lincoln; and in the churchyard, after the thirty-first of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves for the burials of those only whose wives or husbands have been buried in the churchyard.

TETNEY.—Forthwith wholly in Tetney Church, in the county of Lincoln; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves that can be opened without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of entire bones.

ROTHLEY.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Rothley, in the county of Leicester; and in the Rothley Baptist Chapel; and in the churchyard and chapelyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except in earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins or the disturbance of entire bones.

ROTHERFIELD.—Forthwith wholly in Rotherfield Church, in the county of Sussex; and in the churchyard, except in vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed in brickwork or stonework properly cemented; and except also in earthen graves which can be opened without the exposure of coffins, or the disturbance of entire bones.

HEAPHAM-WITH-UPTON.—Forthwith wholly in the parish of Heapham with Upton, in Upton Church, in the county of Lincoln; and in the churchyard, except in graves that can be opened without the exposure of coffins, or the disturbance of entire bones.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twelfth day of August next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before the said twelfth day of August.

REMOVAL OF SHINGLE PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the 54 Geo. III., cap. 159, that "in order to prevent damage "being done to the shores or banks of the ports, "harbours, or havens in this kingdom, no person "or persons shall take any ballast or shingle from "the shores or banks, or any portion of the shores "or banks of any port, harbour, or haven of this "kingdom, from which the Commissioners for "executing the office of Lord High Admiral of "the United Kingdom for the time being shall "find it necessary, for the protection of such port "harbour, or haven, or the works thereof, by "Order under their hands, or the hands of any "three of them, or the hands of his or their "Secretary, and published in the London Gazette, "shall prohibit the taking or removing of such "shingle or ballast, upon pain of forfeiting for "every such offence the sum of ten pounds.":

And whereas it is further enacted by "The Harbours Transfer Act, 1862" (25 and 26 Victoria, cap. 69), "that from and after the "31st day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, sections fourteen and sixteen "of the Act of the fifty-fourth year of King "George the Third (chapter one hundred and fifty-nine), 'for the better regulation of the several "ports, harbours, roadsteads, sounds, channels, "bays, and navigable rivers in the United Kingdom, and of His Majesty's docks, dockyards, "arsenals, wharfs, moorings, and stores thereon, "and for repealing several Acts passed for that "purpose,' and all provisions in the said Act

"contained relative thereto, shall be read and "construed as if the Board of Trade were named "in the said sections instead of the Admiralty.":

And whereas the Board of Trade have found it necessary, for the protection of Portland Harbour, in the county of Dorset, to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or bank hereinafter specified :

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, under the hand of their Secretary, prohibit all persons from taking or removing any description of shingle or ballast from the shore or banks, or from any portion of the shore or banks of Portland Harbour, between Sandsfoot Castle and the Ferry Bridge.
