A DESPATCH has been received by the Secretary of the Admiralty from Vice-Admiral Lord John Hay, C.B., Commanding Channel Squadron:—

TRANSFER OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE ISLAND OF CYPRUS TO THE BRITISH CROWN.

*Nicosia, Cyprus,
July 14, 1878.*

SIR,

BE pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that Her Majesty's ship "Salamis" arrived at Larnaka with Samih Pasha, the Commissioner appointed by His Majesty the Sultan to conduct the transfer of the government of the Island of Cyprus to the British Crown, together with Mr. Baring, who was the bearer of the firman from the Sultan, giving authority to the then existing Government and the people of the island for this measure to be carried into execution.

My instructions directed me, after communication with the Turkish Governor, to proceed myself with the firman to the Pasha. I, however, found ample reasons to adopt a different course, which I trust will be approved.

2. I directed Mr. Baring to proceed on the 11th to Nicosia, the capital, 28 miles inland, accompanied by Samih Pasha, and requested him to negotiate regarding the preliminary proceedings, giving him discretionary power as to presenting the firman himself, or confiding it to Samih Pasha.

I also directed my Flag Captain, Captain Harry H. Rawson, to accompany them with the view of affording me the necessary information regarding provision for the possible necessity of occupying the capital with a force landed from the fleet.

Captain Rawson returned at midnight on the 11th bringing Mr. Baring's report, of which copy is appended.

I trust their lordships will perceive the intelligence and sagacity displayed by Mr. Baring, whose measures were, up to this moment, crowned with complete success.

3. Meanwhile I had stationed "Black Prince" off the Island, between Larnaka and Kyrenia, "Bittern" at Kyrenia, "Raleigh" from Kyrenia to Paphos, and "Pallas" from Larnaka to Paphos, with suitable instructions to protect the coast.

4. Captain Rawson at once proceeded to Nicosia with a detachment of Marines, Royal Marine Light Infantry and Royal Marine Artillery,

under the command of Captain Kelly, Royal Marine Artillery, as per list appended, to carry thence the flag and to act as a guard of honour over it.

5. At daylight, 12th, I went to Nicosia, arriving at 10 A.M., being received by a mounted escort outside the town. The day being Friday the further official proceedings were deferred until after the hour of Mussulman worship. At 2.30 P.M. I proceeded to the Governor's official residence (konak), and found present Samih Pasha, Pessim Pasha (Governor, pro tem.) and all the notables, Mussulman and Christian, and the heads of departments of administration. I explained the position of affairs to the assembly, in observation of which the appended notes are a brief but accurate statement.

I had the advantage of Mr. Baring's interpretation into Turkish, this being the only language generally understood by those present.

Some discussion took place upon various details of administration, but principally of a character which, although of great importance, may be discreetly left to be dealt with by my successor.

My observations were well received by the assembly, much gave great satisfaction, and the rest respectfully accepted.

At the conclusion, Pessim Pasha formally handed over to me the government of the Island, as representing Her Britannic Majesty Queen Victoria.

6. I have omitted to state that the Marine Detachment passed me in the street on my way to the konak, and I observed that they were accompanied by an immense multitude amidst enthusiastic cheering.

7. From the meeting of the notables, I proceeded to the gate of the town, where stands the flagstaff, and is situated the barracks of the Marines.

A large concourse of people had assembled, the detachment was drawn up opposite the flagstaff, Captain Rawson hoisted the Union Jack, and the flag was saluted.

I then formally announced to the people that I had taken over the administration of the government of Cyprus in the name of Her Majesty Queen Victoria. I may observe that the only word that seemed to be understood was "Victoria," which was echoed by the multitude amidst tremendous cheering.

Mr. Baring afterwards formally repeated in Turkish, but the presence of the flag seemed to be thoroughly understood by all.

8. The Kaimakhans of the various districts have been summoned by Samih Pasha to the capital to receive instructions as to the change of the governing power; they will afterwards return to their districts and the operation will be complete.

9. On the whole I think the state of affairs is satisfactory. I am gradually drawing together the threads of administration and I am avoiding the introduction of any novelties, however necessary in the administration. I confine myself to taking measures for the security of life and property and the maintenance of public order.

10. I am compelled to make some provisional appointments of Europeans to assist me, as their lordships will perceive that the work of administration is not done under the easiest circumstances, when the only languages, Turkish and Greek, which are the means of communication, are almost entirely unknown by me.

Under these circumstances I have provisionally appointed Mr. Walter Baring as Secretary to Government. The rest of the appointments (two or three) I shall decide upon to-day, and will inform their lordships accordingly.

MY LORD,

Nicosia,
July 11, 1878.

I HAVE the honour to inform your lordships that, in accordance with your instructions, I proceeded here this day in company with his Excellency Samih Pasha and Captain Rawson. On our arrival Samih Pasha went at once to the Government "konak," and communicated the firman handing over the island to Her Majesty the Queen to the Muttessarif and the principal Mussulmans and Christians of the place. I thought it advisable not to be present at the reading of the firman, but in the course of the afternoon Samih Pasha sent a message to the effect that he would be glad to see me. I accordingly went to the konak, and was then informed in the presence of the Members of the Council that the firman had been read, and that the cession of the island was heard with satisfaction by the people.

o I conveyed suitable thanks to the Pasha and informed him that your lordship would come up here to-morrow to hoist the flag and to take formal possession.

I continue to think that under the circumstances a small guard will be sufficient merely for the purpose of protecting and saluting the flag.

Time prevents my adding more as Captain Rawson is obliged to leave at once for Larnaka.

Notes of Speech by Vice-Admiral Lord John Hay at the meeting of Samih Pasha and Pessim Pasha, and the Notables at the Konak, in Nicosia, at three P.M., July 12, 1878.

IN accordance with a convention entered into between Her Majesty the Queen and His Majesty the Sultan, and further enforced by the firman of the Sultan, I have been commanded by the Government of Her Majesty to occupy the Island of Cyprus in the name of Her Majesty, and to assume the temporary administration of the Government until the Governor appointed by Her Majesty arrives in Cyprus. I understand from Mr. Baring that the firman was read yesterday in Nicosia, in the presence of the notables, and that you are now prepared to transfer the administration of the Island into my hands.

On my part I have to request that the employes of the Government shall remain in their present offices. Any changes that might be found advisable after experience will be left to my successor to carry out.

The police force will continue to perform its duties commanded by its present officers, whom I shall hold responsible for the maintenance of order.

I shall require all existing taxes and sources of Government revenue to be levied and paid into the public treasury on behalf of the Queen, beginning from to-morrow, the 1st (o.s.), and I shall hold the officials responsible for all funds to the Government, whether proceeding from excise, customs, farmers of the revenue, or other sources.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 90.)—NORTH SEA—HELGOLAND.

Intended Alteration in Fog Signal.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that during the autumn of 1878, the following alteration will be made in the fog signal at Helgoland, viz. :—

The signal produced by explosion of gun cotton from the surface of the island will be changed; and in lieu thereof a rocket which explodes with a loud report on reaching the height of about 600 feet, will during thick and foggy weather be discharged at intervals of ten minutes.
