IT is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Parliament be prorogued from Friday, the sixteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, to Saturday, the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; and that the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain do cause a Commission to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Parliament accordingly.

IT is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Prohibitions now subsisting under Her Majesty's Proclamation of the 18th of April, 1878, on the exportation out of the United Kingdom, or the carrying coastwise of Torpedoes, Torpedo-boats, boats fitted with apparatus to be used for Torpedoes, all apparatus for projecting inflammable materials or firing Torpedoes, and the following articles, viz.:—Pumps or other machinery intended to be used for projecting inflammable materials; machinery intended to be used in the construction of Torpedoes or Torpedo-boats, be and the said prohibitions are hereby taken off.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Commissioners of Customs, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
