THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt, from which it appears that owing to a reported outbreak of cholera in Morocco, all vessels with pilgrims that have left any port of the north coast of Africa after the 27th August, whether with foul or clean bills of health, will be repulsed from Egypt. Vessels carrying passengers only which have left the above ports before the 27th August will, however, be admitted to quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Italian Government announcing that in consequence of yellow fever at New Orleans, all arrivals from New Orleans or from the other ports of Louisiana will be considered as having a foul bill of health and will be subjected to certain sanitary treatment.
