*Board of Trade (Harbour Department),
Whitehall Gardens, September 4, 1878.*

THE Board of Trade have received the following Copy of certain Regulations which are to be enforced at Rio de Janeiro whenever yellow fever makes its appearance there, viz. :—

REGULATIONS framed in obedience to the Aviso of the Ministry of the Empire of the 5th of May, 1878.

1. The present anchorage ground to be extended so that in a time of epidemic in the port there may be a distance between one vessel and another of 500 metres.

2. The suppression of the anchorage ground of Gambôa, if not in normal times, at least in those of epidemic or during the hot months, only six vessels by way of exception being allowed to anchor there, the maximum during that period.

3. The suppression of the anchorage ground of Praia do Peixe, another spot being selected for the coast trading vessels that now anchor there.

4. The selection of an anchorage ground in a special locality for vessels bringing colonists or immigrants in the immediate neighbourhood of the Island of Bom Jesus, and the forwarding of the colonists or emigrants to their destination with the least possible delay.

5. The removal without loss of time to the Inlet of Jurujuba, or some other locality at the option of the sanitary authorities in conjunction with the Inspector of Customs, for purposes of disinfection, any vessel in which a case of yellow fever manifests itself, the cost to be defrayed by those interested.

6. The prevention, as far as possible, of the ships hailing this port, during the prevalence of yellow fever, from coming in contact with those of the infected zone, and their removal thence to a distance of at least 1,000 metres, and there distributing them in the open space in the direction of a line drawn between the Islands of Euchadas and Cobras, and with due regard to the direction of the wind blowing from the bar.

7. The discharging of merchandize, whenever possible, during the epidemic period, afloat and at some distance from the shore, so as to avoid the approach of vessels towards land.

8. The observance of the same system with reference to the articles of exportation.

9. In the event of it not being possible to proceed in accordance with clause 7, and discharging at wharfs being, in view of the nature of the

merchandise, indispensable, the operation should in that case be conducted with rapidity, and with labour from the shore, and the wharfs should be those situate between Prainha and the Customs.

10. The discharging of vessels, from October onwards, during two portions of the day, from five to ten in the morning and from four to six in the evening, so as to avoid work under a scorching sun.

11. The dispensing with the presence of an officer of the ship to accompany cargo in the lighters to the Custom-house, this being an occupation which almost invariably exposes them to the contraction of the disease.

2. The rates of postage and additional sums for registration, and all rates, charges, or fees in respect of registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of any Warrant or Warrants or the schedules thereunder written, or by any regulations now in force on postal packets (which term in this clause means and includes letters, post cards, registered newspapers, and book packets), transmitted by the post between places within the United Kingdom (not being postal packets sent to or from parts beyond the seas), or posted in any post town in the United Kingdom addressed to persons or places within such town or the suburbs thereof, and all regulations and conditions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post now in force, and applicable thereto, shall extend and apply to all postal packets transmitted between places within the Island of Cyprus (not being postal packets sent to or from any places beyond or out of the said island), in the same way as if the said Island of Cyprus had been included with the United Kingdom in the said Warrant or Warrants.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the day of the date hereof.
