A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

**W**HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to the second day of November next: We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Saturday, the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

Given at Our Court at *Balmoral*, this fourteenth day of *September*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-second year of Our reign.

GOD save the QUEEN.

**A**T the Court at *Balmoral*, the 14th day of *September*, 1878.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**I**T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Saturday, the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Alexandria, stating that in consequence of the reported outbreak of cholera in Morocco the Egyptian International Board of Health have adopted the following regulations:—

1. Every vessel having left Morocco or any other part of the north coast of Africa later than the 27th August, will be repelled from Egypt, whatever may be her bill of health.
2. Vessels from the same parts having left before the 27th August, without pilgrims or the like, but with passengers, will be subjected to a quarantine of ten days on arriving in Egypt.
3. Vessels which left before the 27th August with pilgrims will be repelled.
