T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York he prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Monday, the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

THE Lords of the Council have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs an "Edict" issued by the Royal Norwegian Home Department, on the 17th of August, 1878, prohibiting the importation into Norway from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland of dogs, live horned cattle, sheep, and goats. The Queen has been pleased to approve of Mr. John Hintze as Consul at Rangoon for His Majesty the Emperor of Austria.

The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Mr. Franz Kummer as Consul for New Zealand and its Dependencies for His Majesty the King of Denmark.

The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Mr. Lovewell Blake as Consul at Yarmouth for His Majesty the King of the Belgians.

The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Mr. Pedro Juan Marin as Vice-Consul in the English Possessions of North America, to reside at Quebec, for His Majesty the King of Spain.

The Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting unto Admiral Sir William Fanshawe-Martin, Bart., G.C.B., the office or place of Rear-Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the Admiralty thereof, in the room of Admiral Sir William James Hope Johnstone, deceased.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Henry William Kettlewell, an Undergraduate of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, eldest son of Samuel Kettlewell, Clerk in Holy Orders, by Anne Elizabeth, his wife, only child and heir of Samuel Eyres, late of Armley, in the parish of Leeds, in the West Riding of the county of York, Esq., both deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he may, in order to testify his affectionate regard for the memory of his said maternal grandfather, the said Samuel Eyres, take and henceforth use the surname of Eyres instead of that of Kettlewell, and bear the arms of Eyres quarterly with his own family arms, such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
